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



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IN CONVERSATION WITH:

OSAMA CHABBI

Meet the Fashion Critic Revolutionizing Digital Commentary

sama Chabbi is not your typical fashion critic. The Tunisian-French stylist, now based in Dubai, has become a key voice in fashion critique thanks to his sharp wit, deep industry knowledge and a knack for connecting with audiences across the digital landscape.

Having worked with iconic brands like Amina Muaddi, Chanel, Prada and Jacquemus, Chabbi's ability to break down fashion shows into insightful, engaging commentary has quickly gained him recognition, "My approach to digital media and storytelling is deeply rooted in creating formats that include the audience, offering them a truly human experience — something often lacking in fashion," Osama says. "Humans need humans, and people are inspired by those they can relate to."

Chabbi's journey into fashion started in 2018 after a brief stint in PR. With a degree in Applied Languages and Geopolitics, he wasn't your typical fashion school graduate. But as he began styling editorial shoots and campaigns, his deep analytical eye became apparent, helping him

When the pandemic hit and the world of fashion shifted to digital, Osama saw an opportunity. "When everything went digital, I realized that no one could take my thoughts away from me," he says. "Everyone was watching Fashion Week from the same perspective, through livestreams." This realization was pivotal for Chabbi, sparking his venture into fashion criticism with his Reviewed by Osa format on Instagram. This approach quickly became a favorite among fashion insiders, allowing him to share his thoughts on runway collections with humor, insight, and clarity.

Chabbi's online reviews and commentary soon attracted the attention of major fashion houses like Louis Vuitton, Jacquemus and Chanel. But he didn't stop there. After his success with reviews, he sought to expand his platform into something even more conversational. This led to his first breakthrough: an intimate interview with Haider Ackermann, then the guest designer for Jean Paul Gaultier Haute Couture. "Haider asked me what my job was. I told him, 'I guess I'm officially a fashion journalist after this interview," Osama recalls.

That first interview with Ackermann marked the beginning of his Institutional Sit-Downs series, where Osama interviews major players in the fashion industry, including Kris Van Assche, Amina Muaddi, Michèle Lamy, and Glenn Martens. These conversations, fueled by Chabbi's admiration for craftsmanship and his deep respect for the industry's history, have offered his audience rare insights into the minds of those shaping the future of fashion.

"I used to watch runway collections in awe, with absolute admiration and respect for these figures — never imagining I'd have the chance to speak with them, let alone on camera," Osama says. "These conversations are a tribute to the institutional voices that shaped my love for fashion as a child."

But Osama's journey hasn't just been about the past — it's about the future. His latest project, Friends & Voices, is an innovative interview format designed for the digital age. Unlike his longer, more in-depth Institutional Sit-Downs, Friends & Voices features rapid-fire, voicenote interviews edited into visually stimulating Instagram Reels. "This series is a tribute to the friends and voices that define the industry — it's a celebration of these individuals," he explains.

The first season of Friends & Voices featured an impressive lineup of fashion figures, including Imaan Hammam, Farida Khelfa and Nora Attal. And it's only getting bigger, with upcoming guests including Coperni's Arnaud Vaillant and Sébastien Meyer, Stefano Pilati and American rapper Kid Cudi.

Beyond his digital presence, Osama is increasingly sought after for his expertise in the fashion industry. He's taken on consulting roles with brands like The Frankie Shop and Duha, and he's also been tapped to moderate talks at industry events, such as BoF Crossroads in Dubai. "My time at Farfetch truly enabled me to understand luxury fashion and its retail ecosystem at an accelerated pace," he says of his three-year stint with the luxury retailer. "It gave me significant insights into the region, its external perception, and the global blind spots that were missing here."

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



Let's start from the beginning. You were born in Istanbul, but you spent a lot of your childhood abroad. How did growing up internationally shape your view on acting, and what drew you to it initially? Having had the opportunity as a child not only to observe but to interact and live in so many different and diverse cultures and countries has definitely had an impact on my career as an actor, simply because it has had such an impact on me as a person. I grew up in a family that appreciated films and spent time together watching films constantly and as I child I just remember being mesmerized by them. Honestly, it was always this thing that I dreamt of as a child, but it wasn't until high school, and my theatre teacher Mrs. Kurzym, that I truly understood what acting entailed and the kinds of works actors did for their roles that would bind me to go down this path.

Your early acting days took you to L.A., where you worked on a couple of Roger Corman movies. What was that experience like, and how did it influence your understanding of the industry? While I got to work with Roger, I really didn't understand the depth of Roger Corman and the decades impact he had on the entertainment industry in Hollywood. I find it funny just thinking about my audition and just the time on set; he was just Roger. Couldn't be happier to say I got to work with him.

Returning to Turkey marked a major shift in your career. Tell us about how you landed your first major role in "Waiting for the Sun"? I came back to Turkey for a couple of reasons. One was the fact I had to do my military service and the other was I wanted to explore the city I was born in and felt the need to get out of LA a bit. Months had passed, I was getting ready to head back to Los Angeles and a casting director I had met called me for an audition; I told her I was headed back to America and she told me she thought I'd be great for a role and really wanted me to audition. One thing led to another - I got the part and it was the role that really got my career going.

Did you feel pressure to prove yourself in the Turkish entertainment industry? I guess I've been lucky with the projects I've done and the people I've gotten to work with; however, it's been 13 years I've been in the Turkish entertainment industry and to be honest. I've never felt any pressure to prove myself to the industry; my only real concern and pressure for each project and character that I play is the audience. I do this not for an industry but for the audience who watches it or will watch it. I feel like the pressure for all of it lies there.

Fast forward to 2020, and you became a household name with "Love Is in the Air." How did this role change your life, both professionally and personally? It really was a show that I don't think any of us expected to be so big and such a global success. Before we started shooting, I just remember wanting to create

a positive atmosphere on set. Since it was during the pandemic, we also knew we had the opportunity to entertain and support people during such tough times. We wanted to give them something they would enjoy watching, offering a few hours each week to disconnect from harsh realities and simply enjoy. Knowing that we accomplished that for so many people worldwide is a priceless feeling that makes you feel incredibly happy.

This role garnered you a lot of international attention. Was it something you expected? I mean, with Turkish TV series, you never really know what will be an international hit and what won't, but you know the potential is always there. So, I can't say it's something I expected or even thought about. I truly enjoyed playing Serkan Bolat, and our show creator, Avse Kutlu Uner, did a phenomenal job of creating a character that gave me so much room to develop. I absolutely loved developing him, creating habits and little quirks, and I really enjoyed playing Serkan so much.

We all have those "wow" moments where life feels surreal. What's been your most unforgettable "pinch-me" moment in your career so for? There have been so many moments. There have been times when I think, 'I used to watch that actor as a child, and now we're having dinner or talking.' Moments like that are just wild. I really love the times I get to interact with people who support and have enjoyed the work I've done. (I'm not a huge fan of the word 'fan.')

However, I think the most recent memorable moment would be when the film I wrote with my buddy Osman Kaya, Blue Cave, was picked up by Amazon, and my production company, BraveBorn Films, got the green light to shoot it. Being on that set and experiencing the things we spent days discussing - whether it was how the scene should unfold, what the character would say, or even a plot twist - seeing it all come to life was incredibly emotional and surreal. To add to it, shooting the film with the director, Altan Donmez, who gave me my big break and believed in me for my first Turkish project, Güneşi Beklerken, was a fullcircle moment. Surreal! (He also directed Love is in the Air and other projects I've been in.)

You're often seen in a variety of looks, whether it's on the red carpet or in everyday life. How would you describe your personal style? I am very simple when it comes to style - less is more. Give me jeans, a T-shirt and some boots, and I'm all good.

Cartier is known for its timeless elegance. How does the idea of timeless style resonate with you, both in terms of fashion and in your approach to your career? I think to be timeless is key, I believe that comes with character. I'm not someone who believes in style or career representing me - my character represents me and my style or my career compliments it.

Reinventing the mechanical masterpiece with the Big Bang MECA-10

ince Hublot first introduced the Big Bang MECA-10 in 2016, it's been a watch that boldly strays from tradition. Now, after nearly a decade of pushing boundaries, Hublot is back with a fresh spin. The Big Bang MECA-10 42mm brings the same mind-bending mechanics, but in a more compact, visually captivating package – available in King Gold, Titanium, and Frosted Carbon. The design feels like the mechanical future meets the avantgarde, and it's hard to take your eyes off it.

What makes this watch so special? It's all about the movement – or rather, how it turns the concept of movement on its head. The MECA-10 doesn't just tell time; it reveals time. With no traditional dial, the watch is built around an exposed, skeletonized design that's like a three-dimensional blueprint of watchmaking genius. It's an intricate dance of gears, springs, and rotating mechanisms that lay bare the normally hidden complexities of mechanical engineering. Inspired by Meccano-type construction systems, every layer, every bridge, every piece is a testament to the creativity and craft that went

into bringing this movement to life.

The improved manual-winding calibre is housed in a case that remains true to the original's signature "Big Bang" proportions, but with a refined twist – ergonomically sized at 42mm, it's got an edge without losing the boldness you'd expect from Hublot. The movement, decorated with satin-brushed bridges and hand-polished bevels, is now powered by two mainspring barrels delivering a 10-day power reserve. But the real showstopper? The power reserve indicator, which uses a rare "crémaillère" rack system for a digital readout, bringing a whole new level of precision and innovation to the table.

Hublot's genius is in the details. Whether it's the Frosted Carbon case that's completely unique with its organic, snowflake-like texture or the ability to swap straps on the fly thanks to the "One Click" system, this is a watch that keeps you coming back for more. It's a mechanical marvel wrapped in a case that's as innovative as the movement inside.

It's not just about the sparkle, though – underneath the dazzling sapphire crystal, you'll find Zenith's iconic El Primero 3600 movement, powering the chronograph to 1/10th of a second precision, with the second hand completing a full rotation every 10 seconds. The vibrant dial with its signature tricolor counters and rainbow bezel pops against the deep black backdrop, while Super Luminova hands keep things readable in low light. Finished with a white gold bracelet, this timepiece is a statement that screams precision, style, and unrivaled craftsmanship. THE DEFY SKYLINE CHRONOGRAPH SKELETON, A MASTERPIECE IN MOTION

Zenith just took the Defy Skyline Chronograph to the next level with a jaw-dropping skeletonized design that lets you peek inside the masterpiece. Imagine watching precision in motion: the El Primero 3600 movement laid bare, revealing every intricate detail of its legendary high-frequency chronograph. This watch doesn't just tell time – it shows time, with each second unfolding before your eyes. Crafted from steel and packing a striking 42mm octagonal case, the Defy Skyline Skeleton brings futuristic design to life with a bold geometric structure. The openworked dial showcases the signature "double Z" design of the '60s, with three contrast-filled subdials and applied baton markers to maintain perfect legibility. Its 12-faceted bezel and dynamic pushers elevate its sharp look, while the alternating brushed and polished surfaces ensure it catches the light with every movement. Powered by the El Primero 3600SK, this chronograph displays time with precision down to 1/10th of a second, and with a power reserve of 60 hours, it's as tough as it is beautiful. hey may come from worlds apart, but MB&F and Bylgari's unexpected connection has led to one-of-akind creations that push the boundaries of horological conventions. By fusing two distinct yet complementary DNAs and legacies, they've once again united for an extraordinary collaboration - reimagining Bylgari's iconic Serpenti into a stunning new design powered by an MB&F caliber. In this exclusive interview, Fabrizio Buonamassa (Bylgari Creation Executive Director) and Maximilian Büsser (Owner and Creative Director of MB&F) dive into the bold reinvention of this timeless timepiece, exploring the intersection of creativity, craftsmanship, and groundbreaking innovation.

The Serpenti is one of Bvlgari's most iconic creations. How did you approach reinterpreting such a historic design into a highly mechanical horological machine?

Maximilian Busser: The idea and story began earlier, as we had already collaborated before,

with Fabrizio incorporating jewelry into our FlyingT. We launched this collaboration in 2020 here in Dubai, and when we presented it, the press was amazed by the product. They immediately started asking when we would do something like this again. A couple of months later, we discussed it over WhatsApp.

Fabrizio Buonamassa: It was my idea to create a Serpenti that didn't exist before, while playing with the signature elements of both MB&F and Bylgari. If you look at the product, the large eyes are more representative of Bylgari, while the rear part is more MB&F. But at MB&F, you always have the big balance wheel, the striking bridges, and the shapes that are part of its DNA. When you look at the shape, it's the Serpenti turned upside down. However, it wasn't easy to shift this part, and we decided to turn the head.

Maximilian Busser: From the first sketch to where we are today, there's been a process of months and months of what we would like to see and then of course technical constraints,





which draws more innovation and ideas. I always try to see what can be done in a better manner to turn them into opportunities.

The Bvlgari x MB&F Serpenti case design is incredibly complex, requiring hundreds of sketches and multiple 3D-printed models. What were the biggest creative and technical challenges you faced in achieving the perfect balance between form, function, and heritage? MB: One of the many reasons I love working with Fabrizio — apart from the fact that he's the nicest person in this industry — is that he truly knows his craft. He's been creating watches for over two decades, and even when he hits walls, he sits down with the engineers to learn what's possible and what's not. But he doesn't stop there; he loves to push himself further. We have an incredible team that sees difficulties as opportunities. Their mindsets are expansive, and this is what helps us grow and makes us proud of what we've achieved today. After 20 years, I'm definitely not the same person I was when I started. I still have the same dreams, but I haven't become bitter. Instead, these challenges have made me more serene and happier. Fabrizio and I are almost the same in this respect — we're also nearly the

FB: When I met some internal clients at the high-jeweler atelier in Rome, I asked them what they found most difficult. They told me that working with gems or playing with the shapes of the watches is especially challenging. To be honest, they sometimes hate me for this, because I'm someone who loves to push the boundaries. If we don't, we'll just end up making the same thing over and over, and that gets boring. When we create a regular watch in our department, within the first five minutes, everyone is excited and thinks it's a great idea. But by the next day, it's usually in the trash because it doesn't feel like Bylgari. We aim to push those boundaries and

turn them into opportunities to create something new and unique.

The watch's construction is a machining nightmare, with intricate curves and five sapphire crystals, including the snake's eyes. How did Bulgari and MB&F's respective expertise come together to overcome the challenges of engineering and manufacturing this unique piece?

FB: It's made of three pieces from three different materials because one wasn't challenging enough for the MB&F team to tackle! We decided to work with steel, blue titanium, rose gold, and green. I think even the rose gold is beautiful, and creating its case was a complex process. For the design of the cases for the three watches, we had a bold idea to give them a touch of the MB&F movement. It was after this movement that I began sketching the designs.

MB: I've been creating horological machines for 20 years, including 3D sculptures. When you create a round watch, there are four variables: the case, the bezel, the crown, and the lugs. For 120 years, everyone has been working with just these four elements. But when you create something like this product, there are hundreds of variables. Every curve the engineers adjust alters the entire watch, so we made dozens of 3D prints to reach a final decision. We examined it from every angle imaginable! What's also interesting is that women's watches are traditionally smaller than men's watches, but this is an exception. Serpenti started as a women's watch, and now this machine is here to surprise. There was no intention of creating a men's watch; we simply wanted to make an extraordinary 3D machine based on Serpenti.

So, should Maximilian expect another WhatsApp from Fabrizio soon?

MB: We never really planned the first collaboration either. It's funny, though, because you made me think of a quote by George Shaw: 'Reasonable men adapt to the world; unreasonable men want the world to adapt to them. Hence, all human progress comes from unreasonable men.' And that's exactly what we did - we created something that nobody wanted or expected. It's by doing things like this that you can change the world. FB: Yes, exactly what Max just said — these interesting things just happen. Sometimes, we can't plan anything. We start with the same goal in mind, but if you have an idea and simply follow it, it can lead to wonders like this amazing product.

Harnessing Earth, Fire, and Energy, all in one fragrance

Drawing inspiration from the primal power of volcanoes, the Director of Olfactive Creation at Hermès Parfums Christine Nagel unveils the making of her most intense Terre d'Hermès yet. From smoky woods to fiery spices, discover how artistry merges nature's raw energy with Hermès' signature elegance in a fragrance that ignites the senses and stirs the soul.

Terre d'Hermès has always been a note based on bergamot. I wanted it to powerful fragrance, but this new version seems to take things to an entirely different level. Can you share what inspired you to create a more intense, almost elemental interpretation of the scent? Well, first of all, I have to tell you that I love Terre d'Hermès but that I am not its creator - it was designed by another perfumer. However, being able to work on this wonderful formula is tremendous; it's a huge, intense pleasure. Every time I worked on Terre, and this time even more so, the first question I asked myself is, how does the element of Earth inspire you? And this time I thought, I'm quite fascinated by volcanoes. I love this power, this force of lava surging from the earth, and I think that it reveals one's inner strength. So, I thought that was a very interesting idea to work on based on the structure of Terre d'Hermès.

The fragrance seems to capture the very essence of the earth - its strength, its raw energy. How do you translate such abstract concepts like "fire" and "energy" into specific notes and accords? In Terre you have the entrance points and the top

be warm rather than burning hot, so we reworked Bergamot together with black pepper. As for the heart note, it's woody and what I really wanted to do was to recreate the sensation of burning wood. In order to do so, I used cedar wood as well as two key materials: roast coffee beans, whereby you get this roast burn sensation, and then natural licorice to give this idea of intense blackness.

How do you go about sourcing ingredients that can evoke these themes while also maintaining the signature elegance that Hermès is known for? I really enjoy describing my materials either via colors or through textures. So, of course, when you're talking about volcanoes, they're all about heat, fusion... Well, with all of these ideas in mind, I had to find different materials which contain those kinds of aspects. You see, when you mix different materials together, you get a third set. This is something I often explain when I have students come to see me. I get them to smell lime, and they'll say, it's fresh, it's almost smells like a cleaning product. Then once they smell the lime, I get them

to smell cinnamon and they say it smells like cakes, it's spicy. Then once I've done that, they take both smell strips and they mix them up in front of their noses. They smell them at the same time, and once they've got them mixed up, the scent that comes out is Coca Cola. And this is just to explain to them that it's the same work that a painter does; when he mixes blue and red, he gets purple, and this is exactly the purple that he's after. So when I mix ingredients together, I see textures. And here, I was looking for this particular

warmth to capture this aspect of fusion. Black pepper, roast coffee and licorice combined with cedarwood resulted in this particular sensation.

There's something very primal about the imagery in this new fragrance - raw, fiery, and intense. How do you see fragrance as a medium for expressing deep, elemental emotions or experiences that go beyond just scent? That's the only thing I know how to do. I don't know how to draw. I can't sing very well. So my only mean of expression is scent. And through

> experience, through years of exerting my profession, I'm feeling freer and freer to do things. And you're right, there's something in this fragrance which is primal, primitive, yet extremely sophisticated and I like binding the two. Now, maybe that's because I'm lucky enough to be working with materials which themselves have a very assertive personality.

> So how do you balance the technical aspects of crafting a fragrance with the more artistic or emotional elements? I would say that the structure of Terre makes everything easy. Naturally powerful, naturally potent and if you want to play with that, you have to come up with fairly powerful partners - partners that are equally strong in personality. Terre d'Hermès has evolved over the years, but it's still rooted in its original concept. How do you approach the challenge of staying true to a fragrance's DNA while also pushing it forward?

> In perfume design, when a perfume formula is really beautiful and intense, it is easy to deconstruct the fragrance and remove things, so that when you reach the very heart, you still smell the fragrance. The first thing I did with that was to undress it and I came to realize that with 10 raw materials, I had the composition of Terre. Once you have this heart note, which is so easy to identify, all you need to do is lay with it.































Saud, you've been making music since 2010, but your journey didn't always have the confidence to turn those beats into full tracks. What changed for you? I stopped treating it like a side hustle and started moving like I had something to prove. Once people I looked up to started responding to my sound, I realized I couldn't doubt myself anymore – I just needed to trust myself and my process.


Was there a defining moment when you realized you had something special? When artists I used to study started calling me back. You send out a beat, and someone whose work you've admired for years says, "This is fire" – that's when you know it's real.

You were raised in a home full of musical diversity. From your dad's love for jazz to your mom's appreciation for Arabic music. How did these influences shape your sound? Let's just say my ears grew up in two different worlds. One side was all Sinatra, Humperdinck and old-school charm, the other was Abdelwahab, Mohammed Abdu, Abadi, Fairuz and others. I didn't know it at the time, but that contrast became my sound – nostalgic but forward-thinking.

You've had the privilege of bridging Saudi and Western music. What was it about your experience in both worlds that made you realize the potential of connecting these two cultures through sound? I lived both. Western beats raised me, but Arabic melodies are in my blood. I never tried to force a fusion – it was just about being honest with what I was hearing and feeling. you, a way to legitimize your position in the industry. How did it come to be? With the rise of independent record labels, Brij was the way to solidify my presence in the world of music. But once I saw how many other artists needed structure, it became bigger than me. Brij turned into a platform – for creativity, collaboration, and culture.

Looking back now, what do you think has been the biggest shift for both you and Brij, from your early days in LA to making moves back in Riyadh? In LA, I was figuring out how the system worked. In Riyadh, we're building a new one. It's more personal here—we're not just following the blueprint, we're sketching it as we go.

You once said the Saudi music scene had everything it needed to succeed, it just needed the right care. What did you see that others might not have, and how do you feel the scene is evolving today? I saw the raw talent, the drive – just not enough support around it at that time. Now, artists are more confident,

experimental and fearless. With the support of government entities and independent players, the scene is growing into itself, and it's exciting to be part of that.

Are there common threads you look for in the artists you work with? Truth and authenticity. If you're being real – about your sound, your story, your intention – I'm interested. That's the baseline.

You've talked about your music not always feeling "Saudi enough" yet, and that it's still a work in progress. How do you see the "perfect blend" of local and global sounds evolving? I'm not into surface-level fusion. I'm after something deeper – where the Saudi elements are woven into the core of the track, not just layered on top. It's still a work in progress, and I like that.

What's your personal vision for a truly Saudi sound? Something that feels like home, but hits globally. It doesn't need translation – it just connects. A sound that wears its roots proudly but knows how to move in any room.

his Emirati entrepreneur isn't just designing spaces; he's curating experiences. For the visionary behind Villa Aumédan, true luxury is about more than opulence – it's about creating spaces that feel deeply personal, rooted in heritage and connected to a global creative consciousness. He shares his vision of spaces that aren't just seen, but deeply felt, and how his blend of heritage and modernity is sparking a cultural revolution in design.

You've created spaces that blend art, design, and community – how do you define "luxury" in a world that's shifting away from traditional markers of wealth? Luxury, to me, is about intention and experience rather than excess. It's about spaces that feel personal, thoughtful, and immersive – where every detail serves a purpose and every interaction has depth. As the world moves away from material opulence, I see true luxury as something rooted in authenticity, craftsmanship and a sense of belonging, that is felt more than it is seen.

Your work often bridges the gap between your Emirati heritage and a global creative consciousness. How do you bring the best of both worlds together in your projects? I believe in storytelling through space, and my heritage is a fundamental part of that narrative. Emirati culture is rich in hospitality, craftsmanship and a deep connection to nature, all elements that I weave into each project. At the same time, I'm constantly engaging with global design movements, absorbing inspirations from different cultures and translating them into experiences that feel both familiar and refreshingly new. It's about creating dialogue, not just between aesthetics but between traditions and modernity.

Villa Aumédan is more than just a private members' house – it's a space that fosters creativity and community. How do you curate the experiences and interactions that take place there? Curation at







Villa Aumédan is both organic and highly intentional. The house is designed to feel like an extension of its members – people who are artists, thinkers, and cultural leaders. The way we structure interactions, whether through intimate salons, art-led dinners, or unexpected collaborations, is meant to encourage serendipitous connections. We're not just providing a space; we're shaping a rhythm of experiences that inspire and engage.

From the flower studio to the Pilates studio, each element of Villa Aumédan tells a unique story. If you had to choose one aspect of the villa that feels most personally connected to your own journey, which would it be and why? The flower studio, without a doubt. Floristry is storytelling in its purest form – ephemeral, emotional, and deeply tied to memory. My own creative journey has always been about translating emotions into tangible expressions, whether through design, hospitality, or art. The flower studio embodies that philosophy: it's ever-changing, collaborative, and rooted in the beauty of the present moment.

Villa Aumédan is more than just a space; it's a cultural hub. What do you think the future of luxury spaces will look like in cities like Dubai, and how are you helping shape that vision?

It is moving toward intimacy, personalization, and cultural depth. It's less about grandeur and more about creating environments that feel intentional and emotionally engaging. At Villa Aumédan, we're redefining luxury by focusing on experience-driven design, where people come not just to be seen but to feel something.

If you had to pick one thing from your travels that fundamentally changed the way you view design or hospitality, what would it be? Italy, without a doubt. The way design and hospitality seamlessly intertwine there, with an emphasis on craftsmanship, heritage, and effortless elegance, completely shifted my perspective. The philosophy of sprezzatura – the art of making something complex look effortless – has influenced the way I approach my projects. It's

about authenticity, about letting materials and details tell a story, about understanding that true sophistication often lies in the balance between tradition and innovation.

You're pursuing a master's degree in creative management while managing multiple ventures. How do you balance the academic and the entrepreneurial? Does one inform the other? The balance is in the conversation between the two. My academic work provides structure, research, and theory, while my ventures are constantly testing ideas in real time. What I learn in creative management – whether about leadership, cultural trends, or consumer behavior – feeds directly into how I shape my brands. And vice versa, the practical challenges of entrepreneurship make my academic work more nuanced and real-world applicable.

Fashion, food, and design all play pivotal roles in your projects – if your life were a fashion collection, what would be its theme or signature look? It would be a collection that embraces quiet luxury – timeless silhouettes, raw yet refined textures, and a color palette inspired by nature. Think handcrafted details, pieces that feel deeply personal and an effortless blend of tradition and modernity. The kind of wardrobe that tells a story with every thread.

If you could only spend 48 hours in one city to draw inspiration for your next project, where would you go, and why? France. There's something about the way history, craftsmanship, and culture are woven

into everyday life that feels deeply inspiring. Whether it's the quiet charm of Provence, the artistic energy of the Riviera, or the timeless elegance of the Loire Valley, every region offers a different lesson in design and hospitality. The way spaces are created to feel both intentional and effortless – a perfect balance of tradition and modernity – always leaves me with new ideas on how to shape experiences with meaning and authenticity.

Your café spaces, like If You Know You Know Café and Tomorrow Morning Café, have quickly become hotspots. What do you believe makes a place feel 'alive'? What is it about the energy of a space that attracts people? A space feels alive when it

has soul – when it doesn't just serve a function but creates a feeling. That comes from layering sensory details: the warmth of the lighting, the way music subtly shapes the mood, the tactility of materials, the interactions between people. The best spaces feel effortless but are actually highly intentional. People are drawn to places where they feel seen, where the energy feels natural and unforced. That's what I aim to create in all my cafés. And for IYKYK in Dubai that is located in Villa Aumédan, it is now a private members house, it is only for the members who belong.







Originally located in Jumeirah, the new Villa Aumédan now stands in Nad Al Sheba, continuing to serve as a cultural hub – a private members' house offering a dynamic space that includes a creative flower studio, a concept store showcasing international designers and emerging talents from the Middle East, a Pilates studio (GiGi Dubai), and a cake shop (Groovey Bakes).

elcome to Saudi Arabia. What lies before me is a vast desert landscape, with sandstone mountains scattered as far as the eye can see. It feels almost like stepping into another world. Some nights, the desert seems to stretch endlessly, and you may wonder what kind of stories the desert holds. But what I can tell you for sure is that this place is full of history, culture and incredible landmarks, from the Hegra ruins more than 2,000 years old - to the stunning Maraya building, an architectural marvel that has earned a Guinness World Record for its mirrored design, floating in the sky. The ancient town of AlUla Old Town waits beyond, ready for us to explore.

Just a short drive from the airport, I am welcomed by a scene of a camel crossing the road, with the view of the desert and the bare hills in the background. The feeling I have is that my experience here will be something truly unique - like nothing I have ever had before. The terrain and the landscape around me are so stunning that I can't help but say, 'It feels like a scene out of a dream.'

AlUla is a small town with a population of just over 60,000 people, located in a vast 22,561 squarekilometer area. This ancient oasis is a world heritage site, and it's an archaeological gem, with a history that stretches back over 5,000 years. The place is full of untold stories and mysteries, making it a fascinating destination that the Saudi government is eager to develop into a major tourist hub.

HEGRA VINTAGE LAND ROVER TOUR

Our journey begins in AlUla with a unique adventure - an immersive drive through the UNESCO World Heritage site that you've likely heard of: the ancient city of Hegra. This historical landmark, known as Mada'in Salih, was once a thriving city of the Nabataean civilization, similar to the famous Petra in Jordan. The land around us is filled with ancient rock-cut tombs, which tell the story of a past civilization that flourished over 2.000 years ago. Despite the passage of time, these monuments remain strikingly well-preserved and stand as a testament to the ingenuity of the Nabataeans.

As part of Saudi Arabia's efforts to develop AlUla into a premier tourist destination, the Royal Commission for AlUla (RCU) has launched Experience AlUla under the slogan "Forever Revitalizing." This initiative aims to offer visitors an unforgettable exploration of AlUla's rich history and breathtaking landscapes.

Our journey begins at Jabal Ithlib, one of the most iconic sites in Hegra. It's a vast area of rock formations and ancient tombs, where the natural landscape and historical heritage collide. The area is full of intricate rock-cut monuments, and as we make our way through the canyon, we are led to a breathtaking hall known as Al Diwan. This is believed to have been a place for gatherings and important discussions in the past. The walls around us are adorned with ancient carvings, showcasing the skill and artistry of the Nabataean people.


HERO BALLOON FLIGHTS

One of my personal favorite activities in AlUla is taking a hot air balloon ride. Floating up into the sky to witness the vast, breathtaking landscapes below is an experience like no other. This activity begins early in the morning, starting from the hotel, and offers the perfect opportunity to see the incredible views of the sun rising over the desert. As the balloon gently lifts off, you leave behind the ground below, and the world starts to open up before you in a way that feels completely surreal.


Arriving before sunrise, we watched the sky slowly change as the sun peeked over the horizon. The view from above was truly aweinspiring, with the golden glow of dawn highlighting the sweeping sand dunes and rocky terrain of AlUla. The feeling of floating high above the earth was nothing like a plane take-off; it's more serene, almost like you're weightless. From up there, you get a sense of the vastness of the land, stretching far into the horizon. It's an almost otherworldly sensation, one that feels completely removed from the everyday.

From the sky, the landscape looks like something out of a dream. The rolling sand dunes, the distant mountains and the vast desert stretch far beyond what the eye can see. The air feels different up there, crisp and clean, and you can't help but feel as though you're looking at a place far removed from the rest of the world. The feeling of complete peace is overwhelming, and it's one of those rare moments where you truly appreciate the beauty and magnitude of nature.

For someone used to the dense forests and oceans of the world, this expansive desert landscape feels like stepping onto a different planet. The view from the balloon is like nothing you've ever experienced before. The sense of freedom and connection to the land is indescribable. Whether you're an adventure seeker or simply looking for an unforgettable experience, a hot air balloon ride in AlUla is something you can't miss.

One of the most iconic landmarks in AlUla, Jabal Ithlib, is often featured in various travel promotions and is renowned for its stunning ancient rock formations.

Jabal Al Banat, a group of monumental rock its unique beauty and formations near Hegra, is home to 29 intricate carvings. historical significance. These carvings, scattered across the sandstone cliffs, offer a glimpse into the past, showcasing inscriptions left by ancient civilizations. As you explore the area, you'll encounter a variety of inscriptions - some believed to be names of people, others marking significant historical events. The site offers an aweinspiring connection to AlUla's rich cultural heritage.

These signs are symbolic representations of various concepts. For example, the eagle symbolizes the deity Dushara and is a sign of crossing into the afterlife. Additionally, there are symbols such as the scorpion, masks, and others, each with its own distinct meaning. The next point of interest is the iconic site of Hegra, featuring the Tomb of Lihyan, also known as Qasr Al Farid. Despite its playful

nickname, it is, in fact, a tomb, just like the others in the area. The method of carving these tombs reflects the sophisticated architectural techniques of the Nabateans.


In the past, the carving was done from the top down, where the stone was chiselled away until it took on the shape that we see today. While this is one of the iconic images of AlUla, in reality, the site is not yet fully completed. As can be seen from the base area, where the carvings are not yet finished, which is different from the upper part where the carvings on the large stones have been completed, creating the recognizable images known to many.

The symbols carved on the facades of these tombs, in addition to what I've already mentioned, also include other elements. These carvings might symbolize the journey from life to the afterlife, which is often compared to the mascots from other cultures. This reflects the beliefs in the afterlife, a concept that still resonates with the culture and traditions of the Nabataeans.

MARAYA

The remarkable structure standing on the cliff face is another must-see spot for anyone visiting AlUla. Maraya, the world's largest mirrored building, is a multi-functional venue used for various events, including those of global significance. It is also home to renowned restaurants, such as Maraya Social. This architectural marvel stands proudly amidst the vast beauty of nature and the ancient wonders of the region.

Maraya has earned prestigious awards, including the Guinness World Record for being the largest mirrored building in the world, and the International Architizer A+ Award in the Architecture + Glass category. Its unique design has made it a popular subject for photographers, with its mirrored surface reflecting the surrounding desert landscapes and rocky hills. The building's reflection, especially during sunset, creates breathtaking images, where one side reflects the mountain range while the other side mirrors the shadow of the structure itself.



A helmet, a "lucky" number, and a mindset of steel – Al Faisal Al Zubair opens up about the rituals, lessons and rivalries that have defined his career. From the mental game behind the wheel to striking the perfect balance of talent and technology, the Omani GT champion reveals what truly drives him on and off the track.



You've had an impressive career on the track. What was the turning point that made you realize this was more than just a hobby? Racing has always been in my blood. From a young age, being around cars and bikes, I was fascinated by speed, precision and the adrenaline that comes with motorsport. I started karting at 14, and that's when

I truly fell in love with racing. The first moment that made me realize this was more than just a passion was winning the final race of my debut season in the Porsche Cup Middle East. But the real turning point came after winning my first Porsche GT3 Cup Challenge Middle East championship in 2018, and then again in 2019. That's when it became clear that this wasn't just about the thrill of racing – it was something I could pursue as a professional career.

Racing has such a mental component. When you're at the starting line, what's going through your mind? Is it pure focus, or do you allow yourself a moment of calm or even excitement? It's a mix of intense focus and controlled composure. In those

final moments before the lights go out, my mind is fully locked into race mode – thinking about the start, the first corner, positioning and potential overtakes. At the same time, I have to stay calm and collected because one small mistake can cost the entire team. There's

a fine balance between being aggressive and staying patient, and that mental discipline begins before I even get on the grid.

Motorsport is often seen as a combination of talent, technology, and teamwork. How do you balance these elements in your preparation, and how do they shape your approach to each race? Success in

racing is never down to just one factor. Talent gets you in the car, but technology, strategy and teamwork are what win races. I dedicate a lot of time to physical and mental training to stay sharp, but motorsport is a team sport at its core. I rely on engineers, mechanics, and strategists to fine-tune every detail of the car. Data analysis also plays a huge role — we rely on technology to extract the best possible performance. When all these elements come together seamlessly, the team operates at its highest level, and that's what makes the difference on race day.

Racing can be unpredictable, with so many variables at play. What's the biggest lesson you've learned from a race where things didn't go according to plan? It has to be the

importance of staying mentally strong during race weekends. Earlier in my career, I let external factors affect my mindset, which ultimately impacted my performance on track. Over time, I've learned to block out distractions and focus on what truly matters – driving. Having a

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talented team around me also plays a huge role. I trust them to handle strategy, setup and the technical aspects of the race, which allows me to concentrate purely on my performance as a driver.

What's the one piece of gear or tech on your car that you absolutely can't race without? And do you have a "lucky" piece of equipment? There are several pieces of gear that are mandatory in racing, including the race suit, boots, helmet and fireproof underclothing. But if I had to choose my most personal piece of equipment, it would be my helmet. It's the most customized item for a driver – it represents who I am. The colors on my helmet symbolize my loyalty to Oman, and it also features my personal logos and those of my partners, including BMW M Motorsport. I also have a few personal touches, like my lucky number "777" placed around the helmet.


We often hear about the highs of racing, but what's a moment in your career that left you feeling completely frustrated, and how did you overcome it? The 2018 season was probably one of the toughest in my career. It was the first time I found myself in a proper championship rivalry, and things got really aggressive. From the outside, winning that title might have looked like a perfect story, but behind the scenes, it was far from easy. That season taught me a lot - most importantly, it forced me to ask myself, "How bad do you really want it?" It showed me that racing isn't always about enjoying the good moments: sometimes, it comes down to pushing through the tough ones. Looking back, I overcame it by proving to myself that if someone was willing to push boundaries, I could too.

You're a role model for young racers in Oman and beyond. But when you were starting out, who did you look up to in motorsport, and how did they shape your approach to racing? To be honest, I never had one specific role model in racing that I wanted to follow. Most people expect a Formula 1 driver to be the answer, but I was never really passionate about F1 as a kid. That being said, I've always appreciated the level of talent in Formula 1 because it's the highest level of motorsport. While I wouldn't say I modeled my career after anyone, there are drivers I respect - like Ayrton Senna and Max Verstappen - for their mindset and discipline, which are qualities any driver can

If you could race against anyone in history - alive or dead - who would it be and why? What would make that race so memorable? I'd have to say Abdullah Al Rawahi. Abdullah and his brother, Sanad, are the reason I'm still racing today. They were my first coaches and the ones who guided me through the early stages of motorsport. They're still great friends of mine today. Abdullah is now the FIA Middle East Rally Champion, which is a completely different discipline from circuit racing, but I love that we both found success in different areas of motorsport. I'd choose him because it would take me back to the days when racing was just a hobby - before it became a career.







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
