rom harness-maker to leather goods manufacturer, the house of Hermès is a multi-faceted one, its chapters layered with history. If you peer deeper into the core of it all, you'll find that the French Maison has always placed leather at the heart of its métiers. Yes, Hermès leather, a material ennobled and transformed, the keeper of sensory memories and bringer of new sensations, is much more than an object - it is a creative work of art, both poetic and functional, charged with emotion - the fruits of a limitless imagination. When a bag is imagined, everything is called into question; from important details such as the meticulously rounded shape of a handle to the softness of the inner lining that greets the hand, even the simplest things, like the delicate sound of a clasp, are endlessly perfected.

Behind the scenes inside the leather design workshop, around 15 artisan-developers are responsible for making the magic happen. They, alongside the engineers in the silversmith design workshop, work in a creative tandem that is both technological and aesthetic, drawing on inventiveness and the unexplored producing 50 or so models in the women's collection, with four to six new offerings making it to see the light of day each year. Durability lies at the heart of f the house where each object is designed to last and to become more beautiful with age. It is this Hermès quality that allows the object's owner to love it even more thanks to the patina it acquires as the years go by; an Hermès bag can be taken apar and repaired, and every single piece can be replaced - that's the magic of the handmade object. This eternal movement provides the momentum behind Hermès' gift for capturing the era. It is a house of its time and yet timeless, cultivating the meaning of innova- tion, constantly innovating to reinvent itself endlessly, while remaining faithful to its history.



Chapter 1 THÉ JOURNEY BEGINS

Alessandro Michele commences the Grand Tour as the European aristocrats and intellectuals did; with a trip to Italy. Rome was the ultimate destination for every experience and is the starting point of this third Gucci High Jewelry collection. We see the influence with micro-mosaic pieces, made between 1850 and 1870, depicting the Colosseum, Piazza San Pietro, the Pantheon, the Roman Forum, the Temple of Vesta, the Temple of Hercules at Cori, the waterfalls at Tivoli and the Pyramid of Cestius.

Chapter 2 A KÂLEIDOSCOPIC BEAUTY

Heading to the India of the Maharajah, with its magnificent architecture and lush gardens, the multicolored collection is inspired by the 'red stones of light': rubellite, imperial topaz, yellow beryl, tourmaline and garnet.

Chapter 3 OF MYTHS & SYMBOLS

Our next stop on this inspiring journey brings us to the pearl, and to a point where East meets West. A great symbolism of femininity and mystery, Alessandro Michele is inspired by the pearl's many myths, meanings, and historical references.



The 1930s and 1940s bring with them unimaginable modernism, and Alessandro Michele illustrates this change of pace with necklaces and bracelets with geometric shapes in chains with asymmetrical, flexible modules with meticulous structural details.

Chapter 5 THE MODERN DRAMA

The end of the journey is near, as we reach the 1970s with its references to pop culture and free self-expression; psychedelic colors, engravings and enamel. It brings the journey back to the time and place where it all began: the magnetic enchantment of a world that you can always keep by your side, reproduced in miniature.

It is a journey through the world of Tiffany, from its founding in New York City in 1837 by Charles Lewis Tiffany to our latest designs. There are 7 chapters devoted to Tiffany's legacy of innovation and excellence in design and craftsmanship.



True BLUE **VISION & VIRTUOSITY:** TELLING THE STORY OF

The late Audrey Hepburn once said, "I'm just CRAZY about Tiffany's!" To be honest, who isn't? Making all our wildest jewelry dreams come true is London's Saatchi Gallery, who is giving a home to the House's traveling "Vision & Virtuosity" exhibition, open now through August 19. ELLE Arabia caught up with Tiffany & Co.'s chief gemologist, Victoria Reynolds, to discuss her favorite pieces from the archives on show, the legendary 128.54-carat Tiffany Diamond (of course!) and how the brand is reinventing the wheel after 185 years of being in the business.

You've been with Tiffany since 1987. How has your journey been? And what do you see for the future? Each new collection is an opportunity to push the boundaries of beauty, craftsmanship and innovation showcasing our artisanal heritage and legacy in diamonds and gemstones in new and exciting ways. As we work to bring future Blue Book Collections to life-without revealing too much-we will continue uniting new techniques with time-honored ones to create the most extraordinary high jewelry. We are always looking for the rarest and most beautiful gemstones, and constantly envisioning how we can create new works of art with them.



Your favorite must-see part of the exhibition? There are so many extraordinary pieces on display each with an incredible story. Below are a few of the standouts for me in this exhibition:

The reimagined World's Fair necklace is set with the 80.33-carat Empire Diamond is nothing short of spectacular. The mesmerizing Empire Diamond was responsibly sourced from Botswana, Africa and named after our founding city. This necklace was designed to be transformable, another reason for being my favorite piece in the exhibition, whereby the Empire Diamond detaches from the necklace and can easily be set in the accompanying ring. The Empire Diamond is, in a way, a modern expression of a legacy that began with the Tiffany Diamond in 1878. It's this relentless pursuit of the world's finest diamonds that underscores everything we do at Tiffany.

Schlumberger's Flowers and Leaves necklace is a true masterpiece, first created in 1958. Our artisans spent nearly two years handcrafting the intricate design over a span of nearly 1,000 hours. It is a testament to our world-renowned craftsmanship and the indelible mark Jean Schlumberger has left on both Tiffany & Co. and the broader art world. Schlumberger's Trophée de Vaillance clip (pictured below right) is another extraordinary masterpiece on display. Designed in 1941, this brooch was commissioned by celebrated editor in chief of American Vogue, Diana Vreeland. Paloma Picasso's Blue Book 1985–85 anniversary necklace is a celebration of vibrant colored gemstones. There are some incredible diamond-intensive designs from the Gilded Age and pieces crafted throughout the twentieth century that truly take your breath away. Of course, I cannot leave out the 128.54-carat Tiffany Diamond (pictured below) on display in its own dedicated section.

The Tiffany Yellow Diamond, one of the most iconic pieces of jewelry in history, makes a special appearance. What does it mean to have it at the **exhibition?** The story behind the Tiffany Diamond is almost as extraordinary as the diamond itself. Its history not only reflects the pioneering spirit of our founder, Charles Lewis Tiffany, but our legacy of world-class craftsmanship. Mr. Tiffany famously acquired the rough stone in 1878, a year after it was unearthed in the Kimberley Mines of South Africa. The diamond was sent to Paris to be cut, where the House's first Chief Gemmologist, Dr. George Frederick Kunz, oversaw the yearlong process. Over the course of that year, the 287.42-carat rough stone transformed into a striking 128.54-carat modified cushion-cut brilliant with an unprecedented 82 facets (24 more than a traditional round brilliant). Our diamond cutters and polishers make important sacrifices in terms of size as they unleash each diamond's beauty, and the Tiffany Diamond was one of the first instances of this daring spirit, having been cut down to more than half its original size. The Tiffany Diamond is a testament to the extraordinary caliber of craftsmanship that has gone into our creations from our earliest years as a luxury jeweler. It is for this reason, among many others, that the Tiffany Diamond remains the cornerstone of the House today.

Having long wished to "draw prints on jewelry," Victoire de Castellane brings the idea to life. Liberty prints, checks, stripes, and tie-dye feature in the exquisite Dior Print high jewelry collection.

Couture has long been a source of inspiration for the House, and this collection takes that concept to new heights by transposing the motif of a two-dimensional fabric onto three-dimensional jewelry, giving rise to 35 "printed" parures adorned with checks and stripes, tie-dye color gradations, geometric motifs and Liberty prints.

The Dior Print collection stands out for the realism of its prints, which are literally transcended by the beauty of the stones used and the exceptional savoir-faire of the Parisian ateliers in which they are made. "When ribbons undulate, the print must follow," Victoire de Castellane stipulated.

French ateliers have demonstrated

ingenuity and resourcefulness. To

achieve Victoire de Castellane's

desire to create a pattern "printed

on fabric", the ateliers set to work

on the volume and relief of the

pieces. The objective being that the

printed pattern should immediately

stand out on the pieces but without

any sense of height.

In order to transpose the couture

universe as best as possible and give the ribbons their realistic

look, Victoire de Castellane had

fun imagining what has been cut out by scissors then assembled

by hand, rather like an Haute Couture dress that has been

more or less shortened before the

final retouch. For instance, the

ribbons' tips are cut on the bias in one clean stroke. "I cut ribbons

of different sorts and put them

together," Victoire de Castellane.

The Masterpiece

For this star parure, Victoire de Castellane brings together floral prints and stripes. To create the necklace's articulated links, master jewelers borrowed a specialized savoir-faire from watchmaking.

Composed of several interlaced ribbons, it offers an unexpected mix of flower and striped prints. The necklace's circumference is composed of very regular barrettes, all linked together to provide flexibility and comfort during wear.


What inspired you to pursue your career as an art consultant and collector? My mother is an interior designer and my father owns a lighting design and supply company, so I was always surrounded by art at home. I used to go with my parents every year to visit furniture and lighting fairs around Europe. After visiting lots of them, I felt confident enough and that it was a good opportunity for me to enter this field and build my own

You're still quite young; when did you start your business? I started my business in 2019, while I was still a student at King's College London. Living in London was convenient for my mother, she used to send me to galleries to acquire pieces for her clients, I was able to build good relationships with galleries and artists from early on.

What advice would you give to other budding entrepreneurs who want to start their own business? Patience and determination are definitely a must. Recognizing and seizing opportunities is also top of the list. When I first got the idea to start my own company, Bechara Art Consultancy, I discussed my plans with a few mentors I look up to. I seized the opportunity I had, which were the good relationships I had built with artists and galleries.

Opportunities don't last long; act upon them. A good example, one year after I started my business, one of my clients asked me if I would be able to contact Mr. Alec Monopoly to paint a car they had that meant a lot to them, thanks to my connections and relationships, I was able to get this done, which helped me in getting new clients in the GCC area through word of mouth. I realized that this was a good opportunity for me to build a stronger relationship with Mr. Alec Monopoly and did all I could do in my capacity to make this possible.


How do you balance your time between work and personal life? Balancing my work and personal life is very important. When I first started my business, I was balancing time between work, university and my personal life. Always make sure to keep time for yourself; I find early morning is the best time to focus on work and studies, and I don't work or study late at night because productivity decreases in the late hours of the day. When I'm not working I love a game of tennis, reading, and watching documentaries.















LOVE OF THE CRAFT

What I love most about performing is engaging with the audience and getting the chance to connect with my fans on stage. It gives me an unparalleled sense of fulfillment. Live performances crown weeks and months of hard work behind the scenes: the rehearsals, the practice, the long hours spent in the studio. The audience's applause and cheers are the reward to all that hard work. I am very grateful to have fulfilled my dream of performing in front of an audience who loves me, listens to my songs and follows my work.

A WOMAN OF MANY HATS

Singing, directing and acting reflect my artistic identity. They are complementary, fun and enriching to my career. They are different yet so alike as they are all means of artistic expression and each one of them brings out something different and new in me. Not only am I passionate about these three fields, I'm also a Performance Arts graduate with a bachelor's degree in acting and directing. I have studied music in private conservatories and have attended singing workshops in the US. Singing is based on vocals and the voice which are inherent to the singer that's why singing was my first means of artistic expression and my priority. I have created albums, music videos and performed on stage for many years now and I intend to do so for many years to come. Singing is part of who I am and I think that the actress or director in me will evolve as I grow.

A STAR IS BORN

I started at a very young age from a stage many artists aspire to reach one day in their career. The place I started from is like a blessing; the fact that I first set foot on stage with the Rahbani family when I was only 18 came with a big responsibility but it also gave me a lot of credibility because when two great artists such as Oussama or Mansour Rahbani put their trust in an artist and ask them to perform on their stage and deliver their work to the public, it means they believe in them and in their talent. So the difficulty was not to be taken seriously but rather to live up to the responsibility I was given and to work on its sustainability. Anyone can get a huge opportunity and rise to fame quickly. It is of the utmost importance to be consistent, persistent and to evolve in order to meet people's ever-changing expectations.

MAGICAL MOMENTS

My favorite performance to date is the concert "A Night of Hope", the largest concert to be held in Beirut since the port blast in 2020. It marked a milestone in my journey. It was a dream for Oussama and me to do an admission free concert of this caliber amid the very difficult circumstances Lebanon is going through. We wouldn't have been able to make this dream come true without the support of partners, sponsors, collaborators, technical and artistic teams who worked with us hand in hand. Today I can say the concert was a huge success and it offered Lebanese people a magical night, a night of hope in spite of all the hard times. The second performance that also marked a milestone in my career is my live concert in the KSA on December, 2017. I was the first woman to perform at a concert in Saudi Arabia. I feel honored to have been chosen and I remember how women in the audience interacted and sang in unison "Min Li Byekhtar", a song on women empowerment and the power they hold when it comes to taking control of their lives.

WORK & FRIENDSHIP WITH A LEGEND

My journey with Oussama Rahbani goes back to my very first performance in "Return of The Phoenix", in 2007. Following that, we worked together on three musical plays in addition to many albums that were composed and produced by Oussama alongside their music videos. Oussama was the first one to believe in me and to give me the opportunity to prove myself. With that came a huge responsibility that I had to live up to. He stimulates my creativity, brings out the best in me and encourages me to work harder. He constantly challenges me, motivates me and pushes me to go beyond my boundaries in order to evolve.

FUTURE FRUIT

Oussama and I have been working for three years now on a new album in Arabic. This album took so long because its content is sought-after and because it was recorded in different countries including Lebanon, France and the US. Besides, its release was delayed by the pandemic that put the world on hold for very long, the difficult circumstances Lebanon was and is still facing and the time I took off after delivering my baby. I was very involved in the whole creation process and now we are putting the final touches to the album. I am very excited to share it with my audience and fans because it holds many surprises, a lot of new elements in terms of music, lyrics, topics, production, content, visuals and vision in general. Furthermore; I co-wrote some of the songs' lyrics and music and that means a lot me because it allowed me to express myself not only through my voice and interpretation but through the lyrics and music (in some of the songs) as well. This album also includes collaborations with many poets, composers and producers whom we are working with for the first time and this also adds a new spirit to the album. It is also musically produced and supervised by Oussama Rahbani and it will be released in collaboration with Universal Arabic Music, the international and leading music label that aims to promote the Arabic music at a global scale. In addition to the partnership with UAM, I would like to announce my collaboration with SALXCO, the international management company founded by Wassim Sal Slaiby who is also it's CEO and the manager of The Weeknd, Doja Cat, Swedish House Mafia, French Montana, Brandy, and many others. I would like to extend my thanks to Sal for his appreciation to our work (Oussama & I) from day one and for his continuous support especially to this album and all our upcoming projects. He really believes in me, and in this project, which is really motivating. The collaboration with Sal, the mogul of the music industry, through SALXCO and Universal Arabic Music is a huge added value to this project as it opens new horizons and gives it a new global dimension.

FOR THE LOVE OF BEIRUT

Beirut and Lebanon are main elements that shaped my identity and my personality. Our projects reflect who we are, but they also reflect our culture and the society we live in. As Lebanese artists, our works are impregnated with the strength, the persistence, the melancholy, the love of life, the love of people that are inherent to us. The diversity and openness of the Lebanese society affected my personality, my music and my art. My roots are anchored in Lebanon no matter where my wings take me. I'll always come back to it. One should never forget where he comes from.

It meant a lot to her to fall back to her roots on such a big occasion and uplift work ideally made by Arab women that were, just like her, driven by the creative passions that grow so abundantly in the Arab community. The search for the perfect designer resolved itself similarly to fate when the renowned Swiss born Lebanese designer Sandra Mansour made her way into Dima and Samineh's moodboards.

The union of ideas and craftsmanship between these three brilliant women happened harmoniously. Dima Al Sheikhly, Samineh Safavi and Sandra Mansour began a collaboration together to create what would be one of the most important pieces of fashion Dima would ever wear. A piece that would mark time indefinitely and effectively commit a magical moment to memory for all those in attendance of the wedding ceremony. Sketches were sent from Sandra's atelier in Lebanon to Dima's hotel room in Paris. Zoom meetings were held between the three women to make minute adjustments through the screen of a computer after which Dima's measurements were sent and the first toile was created. On the day of the first fitting, a sunny day in Beirut, Dima and Samineh were astounded to realize; it fit perfectly. A fairy tale story in the making!



Tell us about your design inspirations from European palaces? I have visited several breathtaking palaces and much of my inspiration comes from them. Some of these places include Palace of Versailles and Elysée Palace in France, the Dolmabahçe Palace in Turkey, and Palazzo Farnese in Italy. It is difficult to compare these palaces because each one has its unique brilliance and beauty, but they all have one thing in common: immaculate and exquisitely constructed furniture amid perfect decor, magnificence that we may never witness in this era.

Could you share some of your early influences? My obsession with this kind of design began when I was introduced to Jane Austen's Pride and Prejudice my all-time favorite novel and movie. aroline Scheufele has two great loves when it comes to scents - Roses and Woods," says Virginia Mazzanti, Fragrances expert Chopard Parfums, sitting at the rooftop of of the sublime Martinez Hotel during the Cannes Film Festival. "She loves the personality and intensity that can only be given by wood." Chopard, for the simultaneous launch of three scents under the Master of Woods umbrella, heeded the vision of its remarkable Co-President and Artistic Director and focused on the three woods that are most iconic, like precious stones, but that are also particularly in danger. Because that's the other aspect that is really important for the House of Chopard; the responsible sourcing of these exceptional raw materials. "The woods in the spotlight are cedar wood, sandal wood, and patchouli," continues Virginia. "These are the three woods that are under the spotlights of this collection. They are also linked by the fact that they are

endangered, albeit for different reasons, be it from climactic changes, the ravaging and deforestation of entire areas, or from commercial practices that have demotivated farmers to continue to cultivate and harvest the materials."

BEAUTIFUL PARTNERSHIPS

The story behind the creation of these three new scents centers around partnerships. While Caroline is the heart, soul and vision behind all the Maison's perfumes, she has very savvily surrounded herself with the utmost experts in their field to bring that vision to life. Master perfumer Alberto Morillas is a longtime collaborator and friend of hers, and he created Santal Odeyar and Bois Nomades. Senior perfumer Dora Baghriche created the surprisingly fresh Patchouli de Sumatra. "I decided to work with perfumers I knew – Alberto Morillas and Dora Baghriche – because, just as in my jewelry workshop, I surround myself with people who are dear to me." Another partnership is that between

"We have been committed to responsible creation for a long time," notes Caroline. "We could not do otherwise with perfumes. We have to take care of our planet, especially in the luxury sector. What does luxury mean? That we are transparent, that we are grateful and that we take care of resources, otherwise it is not luxury. Together with my family, I try to use my strength and personality to do as much as possible in the field of sustainability. I also encourage my customers to do the same: we are all moving in the same direction."

"We didn't have a formal brief for this collection," she explains, "The brief we do receive is Caroline herself coming in with lots of things in her arms - an illustration, a piece of fabric, an old fragrance, and other bits. From these starting points, the people she trusts most are given a playground of freedom, it's freestyle creation." Side by side to this no boundaries approach, is the fact that Chopard "doesn't want to label the fragrances by gender. You are free to wear what you love."

Chopard and Firmenich, the world's largest privately-owned fragrance and taste company. "We are lucky to work with them as they are major partner when it comes to sustainability in terms of fragrances and they are extremely committed to protecting the planet and they work accordingly with these guidelines," says Nathalie Helloin-Kamel, CEO of Chopard Parfums. "We have been working with them for five years with the same objectives: top quality natural ingredients with a sustainable supply chains." To bring the journey of the scents to visual life, Caroline brought in renown artist Megan Hess from Australia, whose vivid and bold illustrations recount the story behind each fragrance.

THE HEART OF THE MATTER

"In Chopard perfumes, the common thread is Caroline's love for natural ingredients, so they are really placed at the heart of the fragrance signature," explains Virginia Mazzanti. "It's a matter of philosophy; to explore the amazing world of the finest raw materials and pick them to have the leading role in

creating a fragrance." And in each of the three fragrances, the central star shines through. The tales of Santal Odeyar and Bois Nomades were written by Master perfumer Alberto Morillas. Santal Odeyar features majestic white Indian sandalwood, one of the most precious woods in the world. Perfumers have been using this for centuries to enrich their creations and give them depth, sweetness and a certain mystery. "We wanted to recreate a mysterious garden, like the gardens of the Arabian Nights. A place full of water, dotted with fountains and labyrinths of flowers," explains Alberto Morillas. For Bois Nomades, he brought together two legendary trees: Moroccan Atlas cedar; and Aquilaria (Agar) from Sylhet, in the north-east of Bangladesh, which produces Oud. These have been combined with rose to soften their fiery character. Chopard also chose to use the rarest, most precious and purest variety of Oud in the world, Assafi Oud, from Jalali Agarwood. For Patchouli de Sumatra, Perfumer Dora Baghriche has created a luminous, fresh, energetic fragrance. Fresh and patchouli are not usually used together, but here they reside beautifully, refreshingly.



Master Perfume

For Bois Nomades and Santal Odeyar, he explains that these two perfumes have a very assertive personality and must be smelled on the skin. "It is there that they can express their fullness and majesty. They were created from precious and rare raw materials, and skin adds this magic that enhances their compositions," says Alberto Morillas. "These are perfumes for epicureans. They are perfumes of emotion. We perfume ourselves, close our eves and let this aura emanate around us. Perfumery is a mystery. It's like love at first sight: it's not pre-programmed."

DORA BAGHRICHE

Senior Perfumer

She likes to surprise, and she succeeds perfectly with Patchouli de Sumatra. "This fragrance is an overdose of fresh patchouli, a composition that is both raw and sophisticated, which makes the wearer feel good. That was the challenge! I loved taking patchouli into a very fresh register." She says. "I looked for fresh notes that could be 'friends' with patchouli, both in contrast and in harmony. I selected materials for their freshness and sparkle: cardamom, kaffir leaves, some citrus, juniper, a little anise, black pepper, geranium. There is also a lot of orange in this fragrance as this fruit is very bright and accompanies the patchouli extremely well in its flight."

For Bois Nomades, Virginia tells of the very interesting 'upcycling' technique. "The cedar wood is a national treasure for Morocco and is placed under the control of the government. The essence is obtained from an upcycling project; it's upcycled from the saw dust from the furnishing industry, and is one of the first cases where beauty is born

Anya Taylor-Joy CRÁZY GĽAMOÚR

THE DOE EYED ACTRESS OF A THOUSAND AND ONE FACES AND DIOR'S AMBASSADOR FOR FASHION AND MAKEUP BRIGHTENS UP OUR SCREENS WITH HER MESMERIZING CHARISMA

EXCERPTS FROM AN INTERVIEW BY ALIX GIROD DE L'AIN



y first impression upon meeting Anya Taylor-Joy, was to think that "She's all here!" The excitement of seeing the actress in flesh and blood delicately sitting in the armchair facing me is real. The texture of her skin, the wisps of pale hair fluttering in the light, the brightness of the perfectly red mouth - Anya Taylor-Joy is Bambi! The slender creature with long legs sheathed in dark tights, with huge soft eyes set close to the temples is as much fawn as she is woman. It is doubly surprising when she speaks because Anya Taylor-Joy has a deep voice. And from there, the surprises continue...

On her childhood. Born in 1996 in Miami to an Anglo-Spanish mother and an Argentinian-Scottish father, Anya is the youngest of 6 children. She began her life in Spanish ("my native tongue,", she says), in Buenos Aires before relocating to London when she was 6. She studied classical dance for years - which no doubt explains her exceptional posture - and eventually left her English school at the age of 14 on her own initiative to study acting in New York. Why did she run away from London at such a young age? Anya admit, without going into details, that she was bullied and without feeling sorry for herself she adds, "I think that people don't like what they can't understand, particularly at puberty: between raging hormones and ignorance of the world, cruelty is an easy solution when there is lack of experience. I was quite different from other teenagers and I didn't understand what they had against me. In retrospect, I succeeded in letting go of the anger. I already had a great family and some wonderful friends, and so this sense of hopelessness from being rejected disappeared quite quickly. From the moment I arrived on a shoot, I felt that I belonged. I told myself 'This is it. I finally feel useful.' In my case the bullying was rather formative. You know, the more I advance in this profession, the more I meet people who went through the same things I did; it's often former misfits

On starting young. At 17, Anya landed her first small part, which got cut in the editing - totally normal - and then some secondary characters in several TV series, and in 2015, a meeting which would change her life. Robert Eggers brought her to the public's notice in "The Witch" - she then went on to shoot "The Northman" with him

alongside, no less than, Nicole Kidman, Ethan Hawke, Willem Dafoe and Björk. Anya was launched at 19, and she has not stopped filming since. Today, the list of movies/series in which she is already credited is enough to be the envy of any 50-yearold actress. When I asked her if she was planning on taking a short break soon after 6 years of uninterrupted filming, she

answers: "Yes, I am thinking of taking a few days next Christmas, I miss my family. As long as I am lucky enough to be offered great projects, I will go for it. But I am very much aware that this is at the expense of my personal life: I have given 7 years, body and soul, to people other than myself, and from now on, my team and I are even more selective. To give up my own life, I must be obsessed with the character."

On being a feminist. "As Maria Grazia Chiuri likes to repeat, using Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie's expression: "We should all be feminists!" I don't understand why the word continues to frighten certain women. I think that there is a misunderstanding: People believe that feminists want matriarchy, but no, we just want equality! It is of course a long and difficult process to dismantle centuries of patriarchy, but I feel that we are going in the right direction. We will succeed, even if it is only because since #MeToo we have access to a new lexicon: to be able to say things changes everything. Now, everyone has their own voice to demand respect as a human being and not be judged according to one's gender."

On her hair. She has a good laugh and admits that it is indeed an important subject for her. We saw her as a brunette, a red head (in the "Oueen's Gambit"), and a platinum blonde. her natural color. "I've tried all hair colors because I have always felt that it is super-important in order to define a character. But even being a brunette is complicated, because my roots quickly become a problem on a long shoot."


On the art of applying lipstick. She points to her recognizable pout highlighted by Dior's Addict lipstick, of which she is the ambassador, and proudly says: "I did this all by myself; it is one of the rare things I know how to do! My lips have a strange shape, so ever since I was very small, I have been practicing." Very small, really? Yes, she nods: "When I was tiny, I was obsessed by my mother's lipstick and I used to pinch it all the time from her and put it on the tip of my nose, like a clown. Today, it's a tradition which I have maintained, at each birthday I take a picture of myself with this little circle here."







Preparation: 30 mins
Desalting: 60 mins
Cooking: 1hr and 15 mins
INGREDIENTS:

1kg of Salted Cod • 1.5L milk •
10 sprigs of thyme • 4 cloves of garlic, unpeeled • 250g potatoes
• 1L cooking oil • 70g of flour • 1
egg • 1/2 bunch of fresh coriander

• 10g fresh ginger • Juice and the zest of 1 lime • 1 large pinch of chilli powder • 1 large pinch of ground pepper

METHOD:

1 Place the cod in a large container and cover it generously with cold water. Leave to desalinate for 30 minutes. Change the water and repeat the process.

2 Pour the milk into a saucepan, add thyme and crushed garlic cloves.
Add the cod and cook over a low heat for 1 hour.

3 Peel the potatoes and boil them for 20 to 25 minutes in salted water until soft.

4 Once the cod is cooked, strain the

cooking milk, setting aside 250ml. Remove the bones from the fish, flake the fish meat and store it in the refrigerator.

5 Heat the cooking oil in the deep fryer to 180 °C. Pour flour into a bowl and create a well in the middle. Add the pepper and ground chili powder and mix in the egg and left-over milk. Mix all the ingredients together by hand until a smooth batter is formed.

6 Mash the boiled potatoes with a fork. Stir in the mashed potatoes into

the batter. Chop the fresh coriander and peeled ginger. Add the flaked cod, chopped coriander and ginger, lemon juice and zest to the paste, and mix well.

7 Form balls weighing 15g each, roll in flour and place each ball in the deep fryer. Rotate them regularly during cooking.

8 When they are golden brown, remove them from the fryer with a skimmer and dab off the excess oil using paper towels. Repeat the process until the batter is used up. Serve with wedges of lime.

When the artichoke stems are tender. drain the water and blend until you have a smooth puree. 3 Spread the artichoke puree onto a baking tray, wait until it is lukewarm, then wrap it in cling film and refrigerate until completely cooled (2 hours). 4 Chop the mint leaves. Zest the lemon, cut off the ends and then remove the peel. Remove the segments with a sharp blade. 5 Take the puree out of the refrigerator, and transfer into a deep dish. Arrange the segments of lemon evenly over the puree and sprinkle on the lemon zest. Add a drizzle of olive oil and chopped mint leaves.

6 Serve with toasted bread

2 Prepare the harissa mayonnaise: in a bowl, add the egg yolk, mustard and sherry vinegar. Whisk the ingredients together, gradually adding the grapeseed oil to make the mayonnaise. Add the harissa. Whisk together and set aside in

the refrigerator.

3 Prepare the tomato-infused oil: put the tomato paste in a saucepan, add paprika, chilli and grapeseed oil. Cook over a low heat for 30 minutes so it becomes infused. Stir the mixture from time to time to prevent it from sticking to the pan. Strain using a cheesecloth.

4 Take the marinaded chicken out of the refrigerator and season with salt and pepper. Beat the eggs. Crush the cornflakes with a rolling pin. Place the eggs, cornflakes and flour into 3 separate bowls.

5 Coat both sides of the chicken fillets in flour, shaking off any

excess flour. Then dip the chicken fillets in the beaten eggs, followed

by the crushed cornflakes. **6** Preheat oven to 180°C (gas mark 6). Heat the cooking oil to 150°C and fry the chicken fillets for 5 minutes. Let them rest for 5 minutes. Then, cook them in the oven for 2 minutes.

7 Chop the Thai spring onion and remove the leaves from the sprigs of coriander. Use a piping bag to pipe bands of mayonnaise on the chicken. Sprinkle the dish with the chopped Thai spring onions and coriander leaves. Pour the tomatoinfused oil into a bowl. Serve the chicken with the remaining mayonnaise.
