FIRST SIGHT

IN SEARCHING FOR HUMANITY AND HUMAN CONNECTION, SARAH BURTON'S SS23 **COLLECTION FOR ALEXANDER** MCQUEEN IS A HAUNTINGLY BEAUTIFUL HOMAGE TO THE LATE DESIGNER

It was under clear blue skies, with the glorious sun streaming through a transparent dome smack in the middle of the courtyard of the Old Royal Navy College overlooking the Thames in Greenwich, London that Sarah Burton presented her homage to her former mentor, the late great Lee Alexander McQueen for the Spring/Summer 2023 Collection. The 41 looks drew undeniably from the House's founder with images of his favorite Dutch artist Hieronymus Bosch, a resurfacing of his infamous 'bumster' trousers and leather bodices, but there was a lot of Burton as well, in particular the giant eyes on catsuits, dresses, and clutches. It's little wonder the collection was named 'First Sight', as Burton beautifully fuses the House's history and DNA with her own clear vision for the future with open eyes. She also injected bold colors - blue, red, orange, sleek tailoring, plenty of strategic cut-outs, and a smattering of sequins and feathers. The overall effect is one of strength, beauty and confidence, perfectly encapsulating Burton's desire to "make women feel empowered."





"We also looked at the work of Hieronymus Bosch, at once dark and beautiful," said Sarah of the Dutch artist whose work was often a source of dramatic inspiration for McQueen. Sarah had fun playing with proportions and subtly - and not-so-subtly! - revealing various parts of the body.

Exceptional quality needs exceptional material and with Loro Piana it all starts with the the selection of the world's highest quality raw materials and a production process that is painstakingly monitored and optimized. ELLE Arabia took a trip to the Loro Piana mills in Italy to find out just how the magic is created...

PRODUCTION 101

In order to obtain the quality and excellence that are associated with the company's products, Loro Piana controls the entire production process through its vertical structure from raw materials way through to finished products. The company owns and operates 9 manufacturing facilities in Italy with one plant dedicated to the washing, dehairing and quality control of cashmere in Mongolia

ROCCAPIETRA WOOLEN SPINNING

Located in Piedmont, Loro Piana's Roccapietra mill is the largest production site in the west for processing cashmere, Baby Cashmere and highly prized vicuña, and is where woolen spinning takes place. This plant is also home to the world's largest analysis and quality control laboratory for cashmere, Baby Cashmere, vicuña and wool. Every batch of raw material from China, Mongolia, South America, Australia and New Zealand, is measured against the strictest parameters to assess the purity and quality of the fibres.







QUARONA—FROM YARN TO FABRIC

Around a 10-minute drive away from Roccapietra is Quarona. This is where yarn is transformed into the fabric that forms Loro Piana's collections. The first step in creating the fabric is a process called dressing. This is carried out on warping mills - machines that prepare the vertical structure of the fabric - and then completed on the looms by inserting the horizontal yarn, or weft, to create any desired pattern. All the different patterns and exclusive weaves spring from the creativity of Loro Piana's designers, who combine fibres, textures and colours to produce legendary textiles. Every meter of fabric produced at this point is checked four to six times to uphold

standards by menders who can detect even the tiniest imperfection in the fabric and repair it. Now begin a number of finishing stages, including the dyeing process, where colors are specially mixed to Loro Piana's exclusive formulas. It's then back to weaving and greige mending, where the fabric undergoes various finishing operations according to the desired look and consistency of the fabric. Before final approval, the fabrics are steamed again, rolled and inspected one last time by operatives who check the color, softness and consistency by feeling every meter with skilled hands. Its then off to storage, where the fabric is stored and prepared for transfer to the Luxury Goods Division or sold to designers, apparel manufacturers and tailors.









Loro Piana's activity naturally focuses on protecting the wildlife and environments from which it gathers its precious raw materials, as well as preserving and developing the manufacturing knowhow needed to transform them which is reflected in its 360-degree commitment to quality. Loro Piana boasts a state-of-the-art wastewater treatment system, which ensures that the quality of the water discharged into the river near the Quarona mill greatly exceeds the standards required by law. Another dimension of Loro Piana's constant quest for excellence.

My father and mother started building the company when I was young. It was established in 1978. I used to pass by the office after school, and so I lived the spirit of the brand every afternoon. Our artisans used to hand me pieces of cashmere and they taught me how to design dresses for my dolls, this is is how they passed on the passion to me.

I like to create and to design, so I attended fashion school. I decided to enroll in the company for one year only, for training. Today, I have been there for the past 12 years and I love my role; I spent five years in the production department another three years in e-commerce where I digitized the company. In 2017, we launched our first online boutique in Solomeo. I am lucky to have the chance to work and stay close to my father, to learn from him and to be involved in each department.

It was not easy at the beginning, my father used to advise us to work a lot, and even harder in comparison to anyone inside and outside the company. He used to say, 'if someone delivers 100%, then you have to deliver 200%'. Today, I'm very confident and comfortable in what I do.

My advice to women when it comes to their career? It's important to trust ourselves, and be confident. Women are very smart and multitaskers. We can manage and balance among family, work and friends. We have a very strong voice and if we stand together we are stronger.

Brunello is not only known for its luxury cashmere and knits, but also the ethical and sustainable approach to the business. My father's idea was to build something that respects all beings and their values. To give dignity to a particular job, like tailoring or knitting. It's not very common to find high quality artisanal workers but it was important for us. He had the vision to build a company in the middle of nature; the offices have large windows with sunlight seeping in, and people can go outside to enjoy a walk and a breath of fresh air. He set the working hours to be exactly 8 hours - not more - each day, which was not common back then with companies. We want our people to feel like they are a part of a big family and to feel at home. This is how our company started growing, and our essence did not change.

I'm here to present some special pieces for the region, abayas and kaftans. It's important to approach the culture in the right way by respecting it, that's why it took so long. We decided to pay homage for the region and to create this collection. We decided to launch it here on a smaller scale to get the feedback from our clients, which is

My plans and projects for 2023 definitely include coming soon to Dubai in the Spring, and I will be visiting the whole region more often.



here's a lot to learn from history and discovering interesting facets of a bygone era becomes a fascinating journey when witnessed through the tales of love, romance, and power. For French Maison Van Cleef & Arpels, its jewels dating back to 1906, the year when it first opened, presents stories steeped in history. "When the opportunity arose to partner with Van Cleef & Arpels, we immediately knew that this would be something unique and special. I think it complements our museum galleries perfectly, by presenting a continuity in the way we have chosen to adorn ourselves throughout time," says Laila Alfaddagh, talking about the collaboration with the National Museum of Saudi Arabia which seeks to make its content relevant to its audience. Featuring more than 280 jewelry pieces, watches and precious objects displayed alongside more than 90 archival documents, sketches and gouaché designs, the first-of-its-kind exhibition is curated by Alba Cappellieri, Professor of Jewelry Design at Milan Polytechnic University and President of the Milano Fashion Institute. "Every



piece within this exhibition is carefully curated to reflect the principles of beauty and timeless elegance under the banner of Time, Nature, and Love. This is an exhibition where design excellence and imagination have come together to produce something magical and opulent," she shares.

Treasures from a Bygone Era

LAILA ALFADDAGH, DIRECTOR OF THE NATIONAL MUSEUM OF SAUDI ARABIA, TALKS TO ELLE ARABIA AHEAD OF THE FIRST VAN CLEEF & ARPELS HIGH JEWELRY EXHIBITION IN THE KINGDOM THIS MONTH

Driving the cultural aspects of interpretation, growth, and expression forward is the role that Arab women have been playing, as some of the world's most affluent and educated luxury consumers. "It is important to look at the bigger picture of culture here in the Kingdom," says Laila. "Women have always been a driving force when it comes to culture. We've carried many cultural traditions and crafts through time and have continuously sought to express our heritage through innovative and creative endeavours." And she makes a strong point, considering some of the pieces on display have been worn by Arabian royalty such as the green emerald necklace worn by Her Royal Highness Princess Faiza of Egypt in 1929.

The exhibition which runs from January 19th to April 15th, 2023, draws inspiration from Italian writer Italo Calvino's Six Memos for the Next Millennium, where curator Alba Cappellieri interprets the Maison's creations under key concepts divided into three distinctive themes. "There are complimentary and contrasting interpretations of Time, Nature, and Love presented through Van Cleef & Arpels' international narratives, in addition to stories that are closer to home and perhaps more familiar to us," explains Laila who brings over 10 years' of experience from the cultural industry in her recently acquired role as Director of the Saudi National Museum. For her, the vision to blend the past with new and emerging trends and ideas, is one that is of utmost importance as it retains a sense of identity that transcends global borders.

And what of the opportunities for future generations and the unfolding cultural narrative in Saudi Arabia? "I believe this exhibition provides an opportunity to better understand one another through design, creativity, and innovation, which reflects what we set out to do as a national museum," says Laila. "By way of this collaboration, we have the opportunity to learn from each other and create an appreciation of Saudi culture on a global platform through a unique exhibition experience." Creating a wealth of opportunities for cross-cultural connections and opening the doors to history and art, the exhibition stands as a source of inspiration and dialogue for visitors eager to discover how time, nature, and love have influenced people and relationships in the past, through breath-taking designs and high-jewelry creations. For example, under the theme of love, the French Maison will be unveiling over 30 pieces of clips, rings, bracelets, and objects, given as precious gifts of love between legendary couples including the likes of Elizabeth Taylor and Richard Burton. "The exhibition features many pieces that have been worn by notable people from around the world, such as the tiara that belonged to Princess Grace of Monaco, and Her Royal Highness Princess Faiza of Egypt who owned a stunning platinum, emerald and diamond necklace," explains Laila. "Our heritage is grounded in storytelling, and one of the things that makes these objects, and others like them, so special is that we

learn about the people behind these iconic jewelry pieces – from those who conceived of the creations, through to those who were lucky enough to wear them."

The exhibition "Van Cleef & Arpels: Time, Nature, Love" is supported by the Saudi Ministry of Culture, and will take place from January 19th to April 15th, 2023.



here does your love of books stem from? I was

immersed in books from a young age. My parents are both avid readers and my father is a great storyteller. Experiencing stories and enjoying beautiful prose throughout my childhood meant that I grew up to become a keen reader too. In fact, as soon as I started reading and writing, I began building my own little library at home, which is something I do to this day.

How did you get into the wonderful, yet crazy world of publishing? It was by coincidence. My youngest daughter refused to read Arabic children's books preferring English ones. I was concerned because reading in one's native language is important for the emotional and mental development of children. She found Arabic children's books at that time to be boring and old fashioned. I agreed with her, so I made it my mission to do something about it. That's why I started Kalimat Group and how I began my foray into the wonderfully complex (and sometimes crazy) world of publishing.

You were only 29 when you started the Kalimat Foundation. How

has the journey been? Kalimat Foundation is an initiative close to my heart. It was a natural step for me in many ways because I believe literacy and reading should be a fundamental human right for children. It should never be considered a luxury. Seeing children in conflict zones, refugee camps, and underdeveloped areas in our region and many parts of the world without access to books is painful for me as a human and as a mother. So we always contribute as much as we can, and I am happy to say it's been a wonderful journey so far. KF recently became the first non-profit in the UAE to be given open and free access for visually impaired and printdisabled published works, in line with the terms of the Marrakesh Treaty. This is a huge step and one that will ensure no child is left behind in terms of reading and access to knowledge.

Best/most important lessons learnt from that experience? When your aim is to help people especially children, don't spend a lot of time planning and analysing. Just take the first step and you'll be surprised how much support you will receive from others. You'll also be surprised that even the smallest gesture can turn into something significant when powered with good intentions.

2022 was the last year of your IPA Presidency. How did it feel to land such a role? It was a surreal moment. When I started working in publishing in 2007 I knew nothing about the industry, 11 years later I became President of IPA. I am the first Arab and Muslim and only the 2nd woman in 125 years of IPA's history, so it was a significant milestone. It took a lot of blood, sweat, and tears to get there, but I did it and I know that in doing so I shattered a proverbial glass ceiling.

You were the first Arab woman as well as the second female president

in the IPA in more than half a century. What would you consider to be your greatest achievements there? One of my greatest achievements was to raise awareness about the need for more diversity and inclusivity at the IPA and the publishing industry in general. The world is a wonderful place full of differences so the running of such an international organization should not be concentrated in the hands a few people representing only a portion of this global industry. So I'd like to think that my presidency created a shift in mindsets and pushed the diversity and inclusivity needle more towards the center.

In 2019, you started a community known as 'PublisHer' led by women to bring gender equality to the publishing world. What initiatives has this program launched since? Probably the most important initiative is the Diversity and Inclusion Toolkit we developed. Everyone involved wanted to ensure we would create real change, rather than simply being a talking shop. The toolkit is designed to be used by those making hiring decisions within our industry. It aims to remove bias, and so ensure when people are hired or promoted, it is done on merit rather than a person's gender. The feedback has been very positive as the toolkit helps people take a step back and re-think their decision-making processes. We have also created a mentoring program which works both ways, so younger women can also act as mentors to more senior female professionals in the industry. It's been a great success, and it's incredible how the challenges we face are often so similar no matter where we are in the world. The reverse mentoring programme has also worked

> particularly well when it comes to understanding the latest technological trends and how they can be built into our business models.

Where do you see the publishing industry in the region going? The publishing industry in the Arab world has a bright future. The pandemic was a necessary wake-up call for us and so the quality of the conversations have improved, as we all understand what needs to change. The fact that many young people in our region want to become publishers reassures me that the industry will continue to develop. Young professionals bring fresh energy and ideas to the table, are tech savvy, and have a global outlook, all of which leads to a robust industry. We have long-standing challenges which have been discussed extensively at regional and local events. Now is the time to take action, and to create solutions to ensure that publishing in $\overset{1}{\circ}$ our region continues to evolve on a par with other global players.

With everything turning digital, people talk endlessly about the way the book industry will change. What do you see are the challenges ahead? The book industry is changing now. Tech evolution has led to new products and fresh ideas

in how people can consume content. This trend is not stopping any time soon and will continue well into the future. The only challenge I see for publishers is how they will adapt to a continually changing landscape. We know that change is important and a natural part of the business cycle but changing business models every two years or so is easier said than done. Having said that, if publishers build agility and robust planning into their operations, they should be able to overcome these challenges and create more opportunities.

riestess of a total, hypnotic and colourful art, Japanese artist Yayoi Kusama is known throughout the world as an avantgarde artist. She is also one of the emblematic figures of the hippie years. True to her signature throughout the years, she applies her motifs ad infinitum, completely invading the space. The last time that Louis Vuitton met the magic of Yayoi Kusama was in 2012. Yet this relationship never ended - 10 years after, it evolved, and expanded with conversations continued and extended. Here, Kusama's talismanic objects, motifs and imaginings of infinity take over the Maison and all of its product categories: from bags to menswear; womenswear to sunglasses; fragrances to shoes and accessories.

In line with Louis Vuitton's past artistic collaborations, the encounter between the Maison and Yavoi Kusama is grounded in sincerity and a mutual appreciation of craft and excellence over the commonplace. This incarnation of the Louis Vuitton and Kusama creative exchange starts where the 2012 conversation left off, with a gift. In 2012, Yayoi Kusama took one of the most timeless and magical of the Maison's emblematic objects and made it her own - she hand-painted a Louis Vuitton trunk with her characteristic polka dots, dots that, for Kusama, represent infinity. It is an exact replica of these dots, a true representation of Kusama's hand that is one of the many things in the project that has challenged and advanced the Maison's savoir-faire. It is in this pursuit of the infinite through craft that both Louis Vuitton and Yayoi Kusama are ultimately united. It is here that both Louis Vuitton and Yayoi Kusama want the person who possesses such objects to feel both the care and emotional investment it took to make them; to become part of their story and one that will hopefully become part of the story of future generations – stretching into infinity.

From her inauspicious beginnings in 1929, in Matsumoto, Japan, Kusama magically and determinedly transformed her own life. Spinning enchantment from the power of her art while on adventurous quests in the wider world in the 1950s and 1960s, from Tokyo to New York, she rescued herself in the process. She is the artist who has given a glimpse of the infinite in her artwork and, after what appeared as a hiatus to the outside world when she returned to Japan in the 1970s, she has emerged as perhaps the pre-eminent global artist of the 21st Century and certainly the

she returned to Japan in the 1970s, she has emerged as perhaps the pre-eminent global artist of the 21st Century and certainly the most successful living, female artist. On the convergence of art and fashion, she says "I have been making my own clothes since I was teenager. I also ran a fashion company in the 1960s. At that time, art and fashion were two completely different genres in general but I have never made a distinction between them. I don't think if them as separate, because that way I can explore new fields."


• The METAL DOTS collection is a glint of the infinite inspired by Kusama's mirrored orbs, a motif familiar from her Narcissus Garden, shown (unofficially) at the 33rd Venice Biennale in 1966. Here, the silver orbs of varying sizes are placed with exacting precision by hand, embedded in women's black and silver leather goods, encircling a Cannes bag or proliferating on a soft Side Trunk, while featuring as almost a space-age gradient on the elegant Capucines.



• The motif of PAINTED DOTS is where this project has its roots and here, they are a direct translation of Kusama's hand through a complex serigraphy technique and embossed printing on leather or iconic coated canvas. Kusama's motifs have travelled with her for most of her life; she began painting her dots when still a child of ten. Here, a proliferation appears across ready-towear, across leather goods, across accessories, and across fragrances, from a colourful iteration of the dots true to the original artwork.



• The painted dot morphs into Kusama's INFINITY DOTS; the artist's most recognisable motif and as a collection, one that encompasses most pieces in the project across all categories. As Kusama's fame grew in America in the 1960s, she was dubbed the 'Princess of Polka Dots.' Although in contrast, Kusama has referred to herself as an 'obsessional artist.' It is the infinity dot that is the most obsessional of her motifs signifying a state of 'self-obliteration' for the artist. 'My desire was to predict and measure the infinity of the unbounded universe, from my own position in it, with dots,' says Kusama in her autobiography Infinity Net.

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Ask the expert: DR. DANY TOUMA

ELLE ARABIA TALKS TO DERMATOLOGIST AND DERMATOLOGIC SURGEON DR. TOUMA ABOUT THE LATEST PROCEDURES TO KEEP OUR SKIN LOOKING ITS BEST, THE HARMFUL EFFECTS OF THE SUN, AND HIS DECISION TO OPEN THE SKIN EXPERTS POLYCLINIC IN DUBAI

What are your basic and preventive skin care tips that you direct to women in the Middle East? Sun protection of course, even sun avoidance in the case of major concern with pigmentary or those with skin cancer risks. I recommend dry sunblocks in humid areas such as the mist for daily use and moisturizing ones in dry areas. Hydration is important but without excess to avoid acne. For a skin care routine, my preference is for Vitamin C and Retinol for their anti-aging effects, to be started as early as the mid-twenties.

What are the most popular treatments in the region? Botox and Fillers are extremely popular and have stood the test of time, yet they are sometimes over used. PRP is now established as a nice boost for rejuvenating skin and promoting hair growth. Laser hair removal has been extremely popular since the 90's, and new lasers and devices that control acne, improve scars or tighten the skin are the new trend. Lasers that tighten eyelids and remove dark circles are also gaining popularity. The craze today is radiofrequency microneedling which can result in nice skin firming, and deep skin boosters for the face and body. The results and safety of these treatments depend on their proper use, and they are highly operator dependent.

How is the process of choosing the right cream or treatment, does the choice depend on skin type or age? The choice of any treatment depends on several factors, including age, skin type, genetics and skin aging, external factors and people's expectations, and sometimes their ability to withstand treatments and even their cost. Most importantly, each treatment is customized and selected to suit these factors precisely to obtain a result that will look natural. Each of us wants to preserve our skin's freshness and youth without surgery; what is the best solution in your opinion? It is possible today to address the issues that cause sagging and delay the need for a facelift as long as possible. This requires patients to take the rejuvenation journey at an early age and seek proper medical expertise that is

able to customize treatment plans to deliver those results. How we do that is by expertly combining injectables, with Botox for the face and neck, fillers and PRP, lasers and other firming or lifting devices, along with proper nutrition and wellness advice. So, a full-face lift is rarely needed nowadays, but I think that some patients may need the more limited neck lift when they have thin skin, weight loss that caused excessive sagging, or when they are not able to keep up with regular treatments.

Injection and filling technology has become the most popular today. Tell us about the latest and most successful technology. This is true, and the Middle East is one of the regions in the world where these injections are used the most, and they have become basic needs for many people for their role in fighting the signs of aging. When applied properly, these treatments not only restore a more youthful face and tightening of the neck, but also improve people's aura, and instill positive energy and improve some psychological disorders such as depression and anxiety. One of its new uses is to improve the neck, chest area, hands, and others.

Tell us about your move to Dubai? I established my practice in Beirut 20 years ago. Since then, I have been consulting in the GCC on a part-time basis, but having a practice in Dubai was on my mind for a long time. The day after the Beirut explosion, I decided to establish this clinic in Jumeirah. Today, I am proud to have assembled a superb team of dermatologists, plastic surgeons and dentists and an excellent supporting staff in a beautiful space. I am excited about the expertise, the customized advanced solutions and treatment plans which are a huge added value that we are bringing to the UAE.

What is skin cancer and which are the most common types and how can you treat them? Skin cancer is the most common type of cancer and is on the rise and I am surprised by the number of cases that are referred to the clinic. My team and I specialize in the early diagnosis and cutting-edge treatments of the most common skin cancers but also the rarest ones. The most common types, the c tend to grow on sun exposed skin and resemble pearly or red lesions that usually invade locally and may bleed easily. Melanoma, usually a black irregular mole that has evolved from an existing mole or a growing new one, is less common but more serious and can disseminate and cause death.

What are the symptoms of skin cancer and what are the latest treatment techniques? At Skin Experts Polyclinic, we specialize in the precise diagnosis of all types of skin cancer, and apply the most appropriate treatments, using evidence-based solutions, from topicals to laser, photodynamic therapy, and of course, surgery. For the most delicate cases, particularly on the face, we offer Mohs surgery, which is done in the clinic, and under local anesthesia. This unique procedure allows the complete removal of cancer cells, as we examine the margins microscopically during the surgery. In addition, Mohs surgery ensures that no healthy tissue is wasted, and esthetic reconstruction with barely visible scars!

s a certified sports nutritionist and personal trainer focusing on post-rehabilitation training, Nathalie Jabrayan has spent her entire career helping people achieve their health and fitness goals. When she first moved to Dubai in 2020, she leaned into her own limitations and decided to help others who felt the same way. "I started training myself after being bullied for being too thin and since I also suffered from scoliosis in the spine, I needed to strengthen my back muscles," she recalls.

After witnessing the benefits of strength training, Nathalie realized that many people often face a similar predicament and struggle with some form of injury, muscle stiffness or a limiting medical condition that prevents them from achieving a healthy lifestyle. "The best decision I ever made was to become a post-rehabilitation trainer, helping others to improve their lives with specially designed diet plans and training for those with diabetes, heart conditions, and more," she shares

positively. The joy in her is evident as she reiterates her passion for biology, when as a pre-med student she opted to study health and nutrition and follow her dreams. After graduating as a licensed clinical dietician in 2011, Nathalie established the Jabrayan Chiropractic and Nutrition Centre in Beirut (Lebanon) and simultaneously spent her time as a community nutritionist working and volunteering with the likes of Nestle, Danone and the United Nations Association.

"I think the secret to success in any field of expertise is your reputation

before your education. Education can be perceived however reputation is who you are as a person," she says, and there's no doubt that she puts the emphasis where it is duly needed in today's commercially driven world of goals. certified Innovation Design Thinker, Organizational Development Analyst and Key Performance Indicator Professional, Emirati-national Eman Bushulaibi was always up for a challenge, until she became the challenge to change, not just for herself, but for an entire organization. "I am where I am today because I look for challenges wherever I am. Becoming the Director of Sharjah Public Libraries is a little farther than the trajectory I was aiming for. But it made me a student again - the thing I loved doing the most. In terms of challenges, I was the challenge because I was the change that happened," she shares.

In her role as the Director of Sharjah Public Libraries (@sharjahlibraries) Eman's greatest task was to uphold the vision of the Ruler of Sharjah, H.H. Sheikh Dr. Sultan bin Mohamed Al Qasimi to strengthen the cultural positioning of the Emirate, not just locally but also globally. It was up to her to lead her team to success and to translate that vision into actionable plans by redesigning the libraries as a basis for community engagement, education, and development. "Leading a change movement was my biggest challenge and biggest achievement," she confesses. "Doing things differently will bring out confusion, cynicism, and resistance. But also, in time, it brings out willingness, energy, and commitment." Today, the Sharjah Public Libraries is

re-positioned as a lighthouse and a beacon for navigational aid, where Eman has introduced a new information technology service, resulting in a 70% increase in registered users from more than 50 nationalities.

A true advocate for constant change, both personally and professionally, Eman believes in the power of a mindset shift with a perspective that change is always in the challenge; and that a challenge is not one that puts you down, but just a chaotic situation that needs to be figured out. To that end, she also admits to struggling with overthinking and dealing with the imposter syndrome. "Ambitious women who work hard start doubting themselves when they see progress. I think this is a thing that no one speaks about. This is my struggle, and this is what women struggle from too," she says.

Coming from a leader who has spent more than half of her early career in human resources, and the other half in strategic planning, process improvement, and policy development, Eman sets the tone and comfort on the subject of vulnerability and acceptance. "Embrace that perfection is beautiful, but imperfection is more enriching," she says. It is with her leadership and direction that the Sharjah Public Libraries is today a member of the Chartered Institute of Library and Information Professionals, UK; American Libraries Association, USA; and the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions (IFLA).

"For 2023, I aim to write a children's book and engage in more learning opportunities," she says, leaving the door open for possibilities that will further bring the youth of the nation together in an international exchange with various cultures.





Within our organization, we've always championed women's empowerment since 66% of our employees are female, 52% hold management positions, and we've equal Board representation. So, building on the purpose of our DO GOOD program, the Unlock Her Future platform in 2021 was a natural evolution and gave rise to the Unlock Her Future Prize, reaffirming our commitment to women's empowerment.

Why is helping women and investing in them so important you think? Empowering women and closing the gender gap is fundamental in achieving the United Nations 2030 agenda for Sustainable Development, and it's well documented that when women work, economies growwomen are good for business! So, we need more women in the workplace, but we





design duo Laurent Bardet and Laurence Jean, founders of the interior architecture and design agency Laurent & Laurence. or the past five years, Saturn has been in signs where he is traditionally strong, and we have felt his relentless pressure in all sorts of ways, from the pandemic to the rising cost of everyday life and much more. 


