A NEW SEASON BRINGS US THE BRIGHT, THE BOLD, AND THE BEAUTIFUL



THE COVETED Handbag Investment

If you've been looking to invest lately, it's an opportune time to consider the iconic Hermès Kelly or Birkin. Claire Marie, Sotheby's handbag and accessories specialist, dishes the secrets that every woman wants to know

hen it comes to securing your assets and making the right investments, there's good reason to consider a Kelly or Birkin, versus real estate, gold, or the stock market. According to Sotheby's 2023 end-of-year report, consolidated sales for the year was \$7.9bn which was in line with their 2022 results and well over 40% above the 2019 pre-pandemic levels. What does this indicate? The leading reseller of high-end luxury assignments globally, Sotheby's knows where to put its best effort when it comes to finding the right bid for your best pieces. "Sales of luxury handbags, led by Hermès handbags for the vast majority, have boomed 115% compared to the sales from

January to July in 2021 for the same period this year," says Claire Marie who was appointed the company's luxury handbag and accessories specialist in 2023. Now based in Dubai, she oversees the sales of all luxury handbags and accessories, assisting clients in selling them across the Middle East and beyond.

Curious to know which Hermès bag has the longest wait time in this region. I ask the obvious. "It's the Birkin Sellier 25, in exotic or classic leather, ideally with gold hardware either in nude shades for a classic look or in bright colors which has been en vogue throughout the year, cshe says. Interestingly enough, results of the July sale held in Paris revealed that Hermès bags topped the lots, selling for four times their high estimate, with 15 to 20 buyers fighting the online bid when it came to the Hermès vintage Kelly 32 and the Hermès Birkin 35 in Bleu Mykonos. "The complete collection sold for nearly

twice its original total low estimate," shares Marie. But what really goes into the making of a highinvestment piece? Apart from the size and color, when it comes to purchasing for pleasure, investment or heirloom, those with customized details are most likely to have a higher appreciation value. "Customized handbags at Hermès are called 'Horseshoes' and are distinguished by a tiny horseshoe symbol next to the Hermès stamp above the hardware clasp," says Marie who, after having spent the first half of her career as an artisan saddler at Hermès Paris, knows every detail of any Hermès bag - inside, and out. "From the selection of each skin, the quality of leather tanning processes, the cutting, fabrication of hardware, resistance of the saddle stitching, the hand pearling and hand edges finishing; each bag follows ancestral craftsmanship techniques," she adds.

With Hermès releasing only a limited supply of the famous Birkin (named after actress Jane Birkin) and Kelly (named after Princess Grace Kelly), there is a high

demand for pre-loved pieces, of which Sotheby's remains a market leader. Coinciding with runway shows, the new pieces are highly covetable and even the most loyal clients have access to only one new Kelly or Birkin in a new color each year. "All Hermès bags are made to last, especially if they are looked after," admits Marie. "I restored bags for 10 years in London and have come across many vintage pieces made decades ago, some in the 1930's which had been passed down the generations from mother to daughter and granddaughter, like they would with jewelry." It seems to be a pretty safe bet to say that, well looked after, these bags should make a sound investment in the years to come.

Did You Know?


• The Haut à Courroies in exotic skin - the equestrian equipment bag which was the initial inspiration for the Birkin 40 years ago - can take over four weeks to put together by one person (each Hermès bag is made by one artisan from start to finish)

 To make a Birkin or a Kelly, it takes an average of two weeks – nearly 10 times the time to make most other designer handbags.

• Following the 200-year-old-heritage, a Hermès bag is entirely handstitched and includes 34 pieces of leather plus 10 hardware elements to create a Birkin handbag and 38 pieces of leather with additional 12 hardware for a Kelly, regardless of their size.







As she celebrates Saudi National Day with *Audemars Piguet, Almoneef* delves into the profound *connection between traditional* craftsmanship and modern innovation, creating timeless artworks that resonate deeply within the world of design.

Nouf Almoneef's journey into the world of design began back in Riyadh. "I have early memories of contributing to the redesign of our home, where I was introduced to the complexity and beauty of design," she recalls. These formative experiences laid the foundation for what would eventually become her life's work, culminating in the establishment of her own design studio. "Every project presents its challenges and possibilities, and each one leaves a special memory."

The influence of art, design, and architecture was ingrained in Almoneef from a young age, thanks in large part to her father. "He enlightened me by introducing me to books of famous designers and architects," she says. "Whenever we traveled, he took me to museums and galleries, helping to shape my worldview through beauty." Growing up in Saudi Arabia played a significant role in shaping her design aesthetic. "Being exposed to a variety of cultures and walks of life helped me enormously in my personal and career path," she explains.

Almoneef's creative journey truly took off with her love for sketching, a practice she continues to value deeply. "Creation always starts with a sketch," she reflects, reminiscing about her time at Prince Sultan University, where she sketched everything from benches to restaurant designs. For Almoneef, art is more than just a profession; it's a way of life. "Art is everything, and art is for everyone," she asserts. Her creative inspiration is drawn from a diverse range of sources, including travel, networking, and research. "I like to mold contemporary design ideas with traditional art concepts. This is where my inspiration lies."

In recent years, Saudi women have made significant strides in the world of art and design, gaining recognition on a global scale - a development that Almoneef views as both rewarding and empowering. "Being recognized on a global scale is a validation of one's talent, hard work, and originality," she reflects. "The empowerment of women in Saudi Arabia has opened up new opportunities, collaborations, and networks, allowing for further growth and development in the field."

This sense of continuity amongst her community resonates deeply with Almoneef, a quality she also admires in brands like Audemars Piguet. "AP represents the classical for me," she says. "I love the multifaceted pieces, much like I love a Renaissance painting. It represents tradition and modernity - two values I cherish in my everyday life, style, and career." Over time, Almoneef's understanding of time itself has evolved. "When I was younger, I felt pressured to reach certain goals within specific time frames," she admits. "Today, I consider time eternal. I've learned that everything will come to fruition when it's meant to."

Milan is a city defined by contrasts. Behind its austere, post-war facades lie vibrant, hidden courtyards teeming with life. This duality, so quintessential to the city's character, serves as the inspiration for Pomellato's latest high jewelry collection, The Dualism of Milan. The collection, featuring 51 unique pieces, is more than just a display of luxury; it's a reflection of Milan itself, where the past and present coexist in a delicate balance, and where beauty often lies in the interplay between the seen and the unseen. ELLE Arabia had the privilege of attending the collection's launch in Milan, where the brand hosted a star-studded gala dinner to unveil their latest creations. The evening was a celebration of Milan's spirit, bringing together the city's most influential figures in fashion, art, and culture. During the event, we sat down with Stefano Cortecci, Pomellato's Gem Master, whose insights into the collection revealed the meticulous craftsmanship and bold choices that have become synonymous with the brand.

THE DUALISM OF MILAN

SUBTLETY AND SOPHISTICATION

The first chapter, Milan's Monochromatic Treasures, delves into the quieter, more restrained side of Milan. This part of the collection leans into a palette of whites and muted tones, echoing the rationalist architecture that defines much of the city. It's in this chapter that you find the essence of Milan's understated elegance - pieces that are not immediately loud but grow on you, much like the city's austere buildings that hide vibrant gardens within. Take, for instance, the blue moonstone - a gem that Stefano Cortecci holds in high regard. "It's one of my favorite pieces from the collection," he shared during our conversation. The moonstone, with its subtle blue shimmer, mirrors Milan's ability to reveal its beauty only to those who take the time to look beyond the surface.





THE CITY'S HEARTBEAT

In stark contrast, the Milanese Color Prism chapter celebrates the vibrant, expressive side of Milan, where creativity knows no bounds. Gems like fuchsia spinels, electric blue tanzanites, and lush green tourmalines burst forth, reflecting the vibrant creativity that pulses through Milan's design scene. This is Milan as seen through the lens of Gio Ponti - bold, irreverent, and unafraid to mix hues and styles in ways that defy convention. Cortecci spoke of these stones with a mix of reverence and excitement. "We're always searching for that perfect stone, the one that tells our story," he noted. His journey to find these gems often takes him to the far reaches of the world, from the bustling markets of Hong Kong to the gem-rich lands of Tanzania and Mozambique. It's a journey that's as much about discovery as it is about forging connections - sometimes leading to unexpected treasures, like the moonstones he found through a chance encounter in Hong Kong.

POMELLATO'S DNA

What sets Pomellato apart is its distinctive DNA - a unique combination of unconventional stones, bold designs, and a commitment to craftsmanship. "We don't just use sapphires, rubies, or emeralds; we play with stones that speak to us and to our clients," Cortecci explained. This approach is evident in every piece of the collection, where the brand's signature use of rose gold, cabochon cuts, and organic forms creates a look that is immediately recognizable as Pomellato. "If you walk down the street and see all the jewelry stores, you stop in front of ours and you know it's Pomellato," he said with a smile. A key element of maintaining this signature style is the close collaboration between Stefano Cortecci and Vincenzo Castaldo, Pomellato's Creative Director. Having worked together for nearly two decades, their relationship is built on a deep understanding of each other's vision and instincts. "Sometimes we don't even need to talk," Cortecci mentioned. "We can just look at a stone, and we know if it's right for Pomellato. That's the strength of our partnership."

In the High Jewelry atelier at 18 Place Vendôme, the jewelers create a model made of precious metal that reflects the original gouache rendering.

The model is carved, pierced, sanded and modified down to the smallest detail, then cast in the furnace to give the metal a sculptor's volume.



What are your current projects and upcoming releases? I'm still in a highly experimental phase with my music, and my plans are constantly evolving. In conversation with ... Saba Mubarak

I have two projects currently in production; the first one is Watar Hassas, a social thriller TV drama that tackles themes of friendship, betrayal, and modern family dynamics. What motivated me to take on this project is the fact that it discusses the delicate and sensitive nature of friendship, which is not commonly discussed in drama. The second project is 220 Days, which I love so much. It features a beautiful love story between a young couple who desperately want to grow old together but life throws all sorts of surprises their way. These two projects are completely different and I'm so excited to bring these two different characters and their stories to the audience.

What advice would you give to aspiring actors and filmmakers in the Arab world? The most important approach I live by is not being afraid to dig deep. It can be scary, as sometimes it reveals insecurities and weaknesses within, but the outcome is always raw and beautiful. Also, work hard under any circumstances. We don't always do projects that we love (when you are a professional). In these cases, you get up and find something to connect you to whatever you are doing. And then commit yourself to it fully. That formula never fails.

What do you believe are the key qualities of an empowered woman? I believe that an empowered woman believes in herself and has confidence that there's nothing in this world she can't achieve or isn't capable of and that she isn't afraid to say no to injustice, empower the unprivileged, and defend their rights. Also, an empowered woman is an educated one who works on educating herself day by day and learning from her previous flaws and experiences to be the best version of herself.

How do you manage to evolve in your career while staying true to your artistic vision? I always read any script that I'm given thoroughly and see if I connect with it. I also make sure I do something different every time, even if I don't 100% like it. Artistic vision is something that evolves and changes throughout time and experience, but I still have this dreamy vision of a project that will go down in history as an iconic classic. So it's a balance that you have to keep between these two directions or elements.



Of course, within all that, you can always work on a project that is purely commercial but still manage to pull some strings and do some things within the character you are playing to make it more artistic or take it in a new direction.

So, to sum it up, I don't take anything lightly. I like to be very serious with any work that I'm a part of. The key is to always try to find something new to sink your teeth in while doing your best to enjoy your job. That's what keeps you passionate. The second element that I feel is very crucial is knowing what you want to say. As you grow as a person, you want to say certain things. You want your voice to be used in a certain way and that also shapes the way you choose how you move forward.

Can you share the inspiration behind launching your production house, Pan East Media? I think I am very self-aware as an artist. I keep checking in with myself all the time. I think Pan East Media was a necessity at a point where I felt stuck in my career. I didn't feel that inspired by the types of projects I was working on. I don't know; maybe I felt something wasn't enough. So, I thought it was about time that I was part of the decision-making process rather than just choosing a project that was given to me to read. So, I decided to start producing after I read a project that I was so inspired by.

And I decided to produce a pilot episode with my own money because I believed that nobody would give me the chance to do so, and I ended up filming it. I then took it to MBC and they loved it. They even gave us a very good budget at the time, given that it was a Jordanian TV production, which was not very common at the time. And it was a big hit when it came out! Everybody was talking about a new genre that hadn't been done in the Middle East before. From that point on, I decided to participate in projects that speak to my heart or include first-time directors or writers.

Honestly, this is my vibe. I would always like to be a part of establishing or launching someone's career. That's why I have loved working with first-timers since I started, and Pan East Media is my baby, where we work when we find something that we are all passionate about. What has been your most treasured possession in your career, and why? If we are talking about something sentimental, then I have valuable moments that I will never forget that happened to me throughout the years - that changed me, that inspired me, that made me cry, laugh, and think deeply - and opened doors for me. Small victories like awards, achievements, or projects for which I was highly acclaimed. There are also little, tiny possessions that I love and cherish so much, like props or wardrobe pieces that were collected throughout the years and the first draft of a script where I wrote my notes. When I go back to it and read it. I think, "Oh my God," and admire the thought process and the headspace I was in at the time. It makes my creative juices sort of flow more. My career possessions are a collection of ups and downs and so many things that we accumulate throughout the years and, looking back, I cherish them as a person and will never change anything. I love 90% of it so much.

Where do you see yourself and your career in the next five years? Doing what I am doing now, exploring new horizons in this industry. I also intend to direct something at some point soon. I'm already working on something that I'm very excited about. I just intend to keep doing what I love doing while still trying to tread new ground and explore completely different concepts and ideas. I would love to start seeing the results of the hard work I have been insisting on doing for the last three years.

How has your role as a public figure shaped your perspective on social issues and activism? I have always told myself that regardless of anything, I will do the things that I believe in and that I will stand up for causes and issues that I want to do something about. I worked on the refugee file for so many years, and moving forward, there isn't a time in the world when your voice means more. I mean, we are living in a very difficult time where injustice and pain are commonplace across many nations, affecting innocents and children. If you don't use your voice, then you are not worthy of the place you are in. This is how I see it now.

It's one of those rare black-and-white issues. You need to defend what you believe is right and stand up for unprivileged people. You need to try and help because the world is unfortunately a cruel place in general and I am not specifying a certain issue. Even in general, there's a lot of injustice in this world, and being ignorant of good causes online is not enough. All eyes are on us right now and they expect us to step up and do what is right.

So, we have to say what we believe we should say and do what we have to do because that's our duty. We have to lead the way because there isn't much that we can do on our own to effect change, but when voices and hearts come together, the rest of the world listens and things do change. Anything I say or any stand I take is a matter of self-respect and I like to always be on the right side of history.

What were some unexpected surprises or challenges you encountered on your journey in the film industry? There are a lot. Stereotyping, body image issues, ageism, sexism, and unequal wages. There were a lot of struggles, but I think, speaking as a woman, this is the best time in our industry that we are allowed to lead and have an interesting role in the scene in general.


Also, I think it started with some members of my family who didn't want me to work in this industry, but then my mother said, "If you want to be an actress or a director, then you have to get an education and learn exactly what you're supposed to be doing," and getting a degree certainly has helped a lot.

How do you prepare yourself mentally and physically before taking on a challenging role? I believe that some actors have a certain method through which they tackle a role — some harder than others. For me, it varies and changes from one role to another. I work with some acting coaches sometimes and I do a few of my design-curated exercises. I read a lot. I think a lot. I spend a lot of time preparing and less time thinking on set.

I am the kind of artist who thinks in pre-production, and then when I am on set, I just let loose and give myself the space to be spontaneous and not think as much. So basically, you just draw the lines and create the structure while preparing and then you lose that while doing the project itself.

What was your experience like during this Fendi FW 2024 shoot, and how did it feel to wear their latest collection? Any favorite looks? It was a wonderful experience and I greatly enjoyed the behind-the-scenes preparation of the shoot and the amazing team behind it. I'm honored to sample Fendi's latest collection, especially since it places elegance and sophistication at the forefront of its identity — values that I hold in high esteem. I felt that each article I wore translates some part of my personality and shows off a different side of my beauty. I enjoyed everything I got to try out, but what I enjoyed wearing the most was the aubergine dress and all the items that complemented it, including the Show boots, Filo necklace, earrings, and of course the large Peekaboo soft bag.

Art, culture, and heritage are the cornerstones for these Saudi women who are promoting cross-cultural exchanges through their initiatives and projects, inspiring generations with their unique vision, knowledge and passion. Here they share what they do, why they do it, and what it means to them.



Zahrah Al Ghamdi, the contemporary artist best

known for her works with earth creating site-specific installations, seeks to evoke memories and reasoning. Born in Al-Baha, Saudi Arabia, Al Ghamdi delves into culture, and identity, our relationship with mother earth and the memories we have of times past, and present. Having participated in several group exhibitions in Paris, Berlin, London, Abu Dhabi, and Brazil, she has also held solo exhibitions in Jeddah, Dubai, and UK. "As a contemporary artist, I explore memory and history through traditional architecture, which serves as a powerful medium in my site-specific works. My creative

process involves the meticulous collection of natural materials such as earth, clay, rocks, leather, and water," she savs

Following Saudi Arabc hiatus from its first participation in the Venice Biennale in 2011, Zahrah Al-Ghamdi participated in the 58th edition of the Biennale in 2019 with a work titled 'After Illusion' which referred to the theme "May You Live in Interesting Times". Her work put a spotlight on Saudi Arabia, drawing attention to the country and its immense talent. Tell us about yourself? I grew up in the southwestern part of Saudi Arabia and moved to Jeddah, where I completed my Bachelor's degree in Islamic Arts at King Abdulaziz University. I hold a Master's degree in Contemporary Craft from Coventry University, England, and a PhD in Visual Design and Arts. My doctoral thesis analyses traditional domestic architecture in southwest Saudi

I do not seek change per se; instead, I desire Arab women to embrace strength and courage, and to boldly express the true essence of their culture and their artistic visions without bias or the need to conform to others' expectations.

What inspired you to work especially with leather, clay, water, and earth? Growing up in the southwest of Saudi Arabia, nature was a source of contemplation and inspiration. It imbued a sense of energy and strength in the human spirit, which drove me to use natural materials such as twigs, thorns, leather, and remnants of damaged materials.

What is the message you wish to convey with these installations and projects? My artworks aim to convey "Latent Memorys" and articulate themes of cultural identity, memory, and loss through contemporary

treatments and innovative media.

What did you discover from the experience of the 2019 Venice Biennale? This major art event allowed me to explore diverse and inspiring artworks from around the world. I learned a great deal about using art as a medium to explore abstract and philosophical concepts. I realized how art can provoke the audience to think in new ways and challenge their assumptions about reality. This experience has deeply influenced my worldview and appreciation for art's ability to address complex issues and think outside the box. What are you aiming to achieve with your work? My goal is to inspire and stimulate both global and local creativity, making my artworks a gateway to experimentation and innovation in contemporary Saudi art. I also aim to enhance the development and professionalism in the Saudi art scene and raise cultural and artistic awareness among local and international audiences.

What are you currently working on? I am involved in several projects, both locally and internationally. I continually align my vision

Basma Al Sulaiman is more than a patron of the arts. She's a woman who has devoted her career to preserving art history, whilst promoting emerging artists across the East and West. Born and raised in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, Basma understood the relevance of art in the unfolding narratives of her country, especially its impact on the future of the Kingdom. In 2011 she founded Basma Al Sulaiman Museum of Contemporary Art (BASMOCA) to enable people to access art and educate themselves. "The idea was for people to access the works in the collection via a virtual immersive experience akin to walking through a museum or a foundation. Having always been deeply invested in the idea of bringing people together in an inclusive arts arena, I kept looking at ways that I could share my collection without any geographic or cultural boundaries," she says.

An avid art collector, Basma has travelled around the world to secure art which she made available in a virtual space. The following years in 2013 and 2014, Basma was recognized for her contribution towards promoting the arts, having assisted in establishing the Saudi Art Council and spearheading the development of an open-air museum at the Jeddah Sculpture Park.

What is the message you wish to convey about art from Saudi Arabia and the Arab region? The art from Saudi Arabia and the Arab region is rich, diverse, evolving and transformative. It reflects on both cultural heritage and contemporary issues. It challenges stereotypes, fosters cross-cultural understanding, and showcases the innovative spirit of artists. It invites the West to appreciate the multifaceted narratives and creativity emerging from the Arab world.

Do you think there is a misinterpretation of the Arab world and Saudi society in the West and beyond? Yes, there is misinterpretation due to several factors. Foremost among these are lack of knowledge and interaction, negative media representation, cultural differences, and education gaps. All these elements combined create a perception that

is very different to reality.

I am working on a social media educational program (via the Instagram handle @ Basmoca) to make art accessible to everyone, not just art enthusiasts. Our goal is to spread art knowledge through simple, easy-tofollow content. This account will continue to highlight artists, current art events, and simplified art history to engage the community and foster a deeper appreciation for the arts.

And do you have a five-year vision? I have a vision without a time limit. My goal is to increase awareness about Art in my country and to promote Saudi Art abroad, as well

as to advance my personal initiatives which is first, continuing to enhance the visibility and compatibility of my virtual museum. Second, to expand my Saudi and international art collections, and third, to promote my social media platform.



Wedad Yaseen, could well

be called the heartbeat of AlUla for her enthusiastic attitude and positivity. Born in what is today, one of the most stunning places to visit in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, she spent her childhood soaking up memories, and tales of tradition. "I was born and raised in AlUla - my family farm sits alongside Dadan. Today, we know this site as one of the world's most active archaeological sites and the capital city of the two ancient kingdoms of Dadan and Lihvan - a vital trading post on the Incense Road, linking southern Arabia to the Mediterranean, Egypt and Mesopotamia," she recalls. With a befitting title as the 'Rawi for the Royal Commission for AlUla' Wedad shares stories of her home with the everyone, while also participating in the archaeological work of the heritage sites. "My role is to share with visitors the fascinating stories unearthed at AlUla's archaeological sites that are currently under excavation. Trained by expert archaeologists, my colleagues and I organize visits to some of the most active

archaeological digs in AlUla to narrate the history of the discovered artefacts and the wider ancient history of AlUla," she says. Enthusiastic about being an ambassador for UlUla, she tells us why it means so much.

How is your role as a 'Rawi' changing the world's view of KSA? As Rawis, we are often the first point of contact for visitors experiencing Saudi Arabia for the first time. We find ourselves answering a multitude of questions about Saudi Arabia's history and culture. Some are surprised about the diversity of heritage sites in Saudi Arabia and the rich and long history they entail. You are inspired by history and art? How does this show in your work? I feel a deep sense of responsibility when sharing the history of the people who once lived here. As an AlUla local myself, I strive to honor their legacy through my work.

How has being born and raised in AlUla added to your role as a heritage custodian? Rawis represents AlUla and Saudi Arabian culture and history. Being born and raised here allows us to share authentic and unique stories with visitors.





IN COVERSATION WITH...



A Decade-Long Journey to Create the Masterpiece Barénia d'Hermès





n the luminous and elegant offices of Hermès, Christine Nagel, the creative director of Hermès fragrances, exudes a serene confidence. Her latest creation, Barénia d'Hermès, stands as a testament to her meticulous artistry and visionary approach. This fragrance, steeped in a decade of research and refinement, promises to be both legendary and revolutionary.

Can you describe the first chapter of Barénia and the myth of the legendary Barénia leather? My journey with Barénia began a decade ago when I first joined Hermès. When I arrived, I observed the house and its essence. I knew from the start that I wanted to create a chypre for Hermès because it's a timeless structure in perfumery, much like the enduring appeal of Hermès objects. Understanding the Hermès women was crucial. These women of impeccable taste inspired me to create something truly special. What is the fragrance's olfactory pyramid and the starting point for this creation? I think the chypre structure allows you to approach it from many different angles. There's the floral angle, the woody angle, and a fresher angle. I wanted to deviate from the classic hesperidia and introduce a green bergamot extract, exclusive to Hermès. Instead of an opulent floral bouquet, I used the butterfly lily, known for its elegance and subtle spiciness. The patchouli in Barénia is processed using both ancestral and modern techniques, creating a natural and raw sensation. The miraculous berry adds an addictive, dried fruit note, complementing the chic and elegant chypre structure.

At Hermès, you take the time necessary to create a perfume, an object, or a collection. How do you combine the creation of your project from mood board to final market launch? Creating Barénia was a meticulous process, combining creative freedom with rigorous collaboration. I recall presenting my creation to Pierre Alexis Dumas. I told him, 'If I were to make just one more perfume at Hermès, I'd want it to be this one.' His response was immediate and encouraging: 'Let's do it.'

Take us through the history of the bottle design and the mythical Collier de Chien bracelet by Hermès Sellier. Le Collier de Chien is something I've always found very beautiful and, as soon as I arrived at the house, it was an iconic piece for me. We're always talking about timelessness, and I think chypre is timeless, Hermès is timeless, but so is the dog collar. When you wear one, and I often do, it gives you a crazy allure, even if you're just dressed in jeans or jogging pants. There's something super iconic about it, very assertive. I tell myself that, after all, I have bosses who ask me to expand on the offering of Hermès, and if it works commercially, great. If it doesn't, it doesn't matter, as long as it's true to the Hermès DNA. I think Barénia is really a Hermès perfume and reflects the brand to a tee.

How does this fragrance capture the universe of the iconic bottle? When it came to making a bottle, we talked a lot. I had many discussions with Philippe Mouquet, telling him the story as I told you. It is important that the person who designs the bottle fits in perfectly with the olfactory story, and Philippe is an artist. Philippe felt that

the dog collar suited the fragrance well. He made several iterations, and all the people at Hermès who saw the drawings agreed it was the obvious choice. The dog collar, with its distinctive studs, gives a unique allure to the bottle. Philippe Mouquet worked quickly. We shared a lot, and I explained many facets of the perfume to him. He left, contemplated, and when he returned, he had a proposal. He really has a deep understanding of the brand and the vision I had for the scent. I love talking to him; he's really into tactile, olfactory things. He made the ideal proposal. At every stage, Pierre Alexis Dumas was keen to track the evolution of the scent and constantly asked, 'Christine, does it go well with your perfume? It has to be consistent with the intention you set out for it.' When I saw the bottle I literally cried as I had invested so much of my passion and energy into the creation of this scent and; it exceeded my expectations and that of perfumes I had created before.

What is unique and personal to your vision of Barénia? The Hermès women are women of refined taste who trust their instincts. Exceptional women like Nancy Cunard, who collected bracelets, and women of character like Alexandra David-Néel, Ella Maillart, and Isabelle Eberhardt, who made bold life choices by instinct, they inspire me. 



INGREDIENTS: Gelatine mixture for the yuzu cream: 1g fish gelatine - 6g water - Gelatine paste for the mousse: 6g fish gelatine - 36g water -Shortbread pastry: 130g plain flour - 36g icing sugar - 16g ground almonds - 2g salt - 70g butter, cooled - 40g eggs - Shortbread pastry: 270g shortcrust pastry - 100g hazelnut praline - 95g feuilletine (crushed crêpes gavotte or spun sugar) - 30g butter, melted - Yuzu cream: 65g yuzu juice - 50g butter - 6g lime zest - 105g eggs - 60g caster sugar - Mousse: 25g water - 78g caster sugar - 42g egg yolk - 156g cream cheese - 10g icing sugar - 285g whipped cream - Blender: 100g white chocolate - 100g cocoa butter - Glazing: 3 tbsp. neutral icing - A few slices of candied yuzu

1. Prepare the two gelatine masses in two containers by whisking the fish gelatine with cold water. Refrigerate for 2 hours. 2. Place the flour, icing sugar, ground almonds and salt in a bowl. Add the cold butter and mix into a sandy texture, adding the beaten egg. When the dough is smooth, roll it out to 5mm thickness between two sheets of greaseproof paper. Preheat the oven to 180°C (fan). Bake for 15 to 20 minutes. 3. Once cooled, grind the shortbread pastry into a powder. Add the praline and feuilletine, then the melted butter and mix until smooth. Pour it into a pastry circle and smooth over. Refrigerate until ready to use. 4. For the cream, boil the yuzu juice, 30g sugar and lime zest. In a bowl, whisk the remaining sugar with the eggs until white. Pour half the boiling mixture over the eggs, whisking as you go. Then everything back into the pan, stir the cream until it boils, add the gelatine mixture, followed by the cold butter and blend for at least 1 minute. Transfer the cream into a pastry circle, smooth it over and freeze for 1 to 2 hours. 5. For the mousse, heat the water, sugar and egg yolks in a saucepan over a low heat, whisking vigorously: the mixture should thicken and be frothy. Stop cooking at 60°C. Mix and leave to cool. 6. Combine the cream cheese and icing sugar. Melt the gelatine paste and stir into the mixture. Place the mousse in a bowl. Beat the whipped cream until frothy and blend until smooth. To assemble: fill the mould with three quarters of the mousse, then insert the frozen yuzu cream and finish with the remaining mousse, smoothing it out. Freeze for 3 hours. 7. Break the white chocolate and cut the cocoa butter into small pieces, then melt them in a bain-marie. Remove the frozen dessert from the moulds onto a wire rack. Use a spray gun to layer over the entire surface. Place the dessert on the compressed shortbread crust, finish with a few drops of neutral icing and candied yuzu.



APPLE TURNOVERS

For 4 turnovers - Preparation time: 50 mins - Resting time: 12 hours - Cooking time: 1 h 35 mins

INGREDIENTS: 500g puff pastry - 4 medium golden apples - 125/150g brown sugar - 20/30g butter - 1 egg to glaze

1. Roll out the puff pastry to a thickness of 3mm. Cut out 4 turnovers, each weighing around 100g. Cover with cling-film and place in the fridge for 1 hour. Preheat the oven to 180°C. 2. Peel the apples and remove the cores. Melt a little butter to glaze the apples. Place them on a baking tray covered with a silicone mat and bake for around 45 minutes: the apples should be roasted and melting, but still have a little chewiness. Leave to cool before placing them in the fridge. 3. Remove the puff pastry bases from the fridge and roll out lengthways to a thickness of 2mm. Moisten the bottom half of each pastry base and place 1 apple in the centre. Fold the puff pastry over the top, making sure to stick it edge to edge. 4. Brush the turnovers with beaten egg and place in the fridge for 1 hour. Glaze the turnovers a second time with beaten egg, then sprinkle all over with brown sugar. 5. Preheat the oven to 180°C. Place the turnovers on a baking tray covered with a silicone mat. Bake for 40 to 50 minutes.

GREEN TEA-CRANBERRY BREAD

For 2 loaves - Preparation time: 30 mins - Resting time: 14 hours 45 mins - Cooking time: 35 mins

INGREDIENTS: 362g bread flour + extra for dusting green tea - 60g cranberries THE DAY

BEFORE : 1. Heat the water to 58 °C. Mix the flour and water slowly for 5 minutes. Cover with a cloth and leave to rest for at least 1 hour. 2. Add the liquid sourdough, salt, yeast and green tea. Knead again for 10 minutes on low speed, then 1 minute on medium speed. Then drizzle in the water until absorbed. 3. Add the cranberries and mix at medium speed. Form into a ball, transfer to a floured bowl and cover with a damp cloth. Leave to rise at room temperature for 1 hour. 4. On a lightly floured work surface, de-aerate the dough. Then make a simple turn by folding a third of the pastry towards the centre, then the other side, to obtain a fold of three - 250g water and 35g water for misting - 50g liquid sourdough - 8g salt - 2g baking yeast - 20g Sencha even thicknesses. 5. Transfer the dough to a floured bowl and cover with a damp cloth. Refrigerate for at least 12 hours. SAME DAY: 6. Remove the container from the fridge and leave the dough to rest for 45 minutes. On a lightly floured work surface, divide it in two and gently flatten each piece with the palm of your hand. 7. Fold over a third of the dough and press down with your fingers. Turn it 180°, fold over a little more than a third of the dough and press again. Fold the dough in half, lengthways and seal the edges. Roll the dough to obtain an oval shape. Repeat for the second dough piece. 8. Place the dough pieces on a lined baking tray. Cover with a damp cloth and leave to rise at room temperature for 1 hour. Refrigerate for at least 12 hours. 9. Preheat the oven to 240°C. To keep the oven moist, pour a bowl of water into the drip tray 5 minutes before placing the dough in the oven. 10. Score the dough using a scalpel, at least a quarter of the way through to allow the gases to escape during the first few minutes of baking. Place in the oven and bake for 15 to 20 minutes at 240°C, then 10 to 15 minutes at 200°C. The loaves are cooked to perfection when golden in colour and hollow when tapped from underneath. Leave the loaves to cool on a wire rack.





VANILLA MILLEFEUILLE

For 6 people - Preparation time: 1 hour 15 mins - Resting time: 13 hours - Cooking time: 30 mins

INGREDIENTS: 450q puff pastry - Gelatine paste for the cream: 2.5q fish gelatine - 15q water - Vanilla cream: 225q patisserie cream -8a liquid vanilla extract - 2g around vanilla powder - 60g single cream - Garnish; lcing sugar - 1 empty vanilla pod

1. Prepare the gelatine paste for the cream. In a container, whisk the fish gelatine with cold water. Refrigerate for 2 hours. 2. Roll out the puff pastry into a rectangle of 40 x 30 cm 2.5mm thick and place it on a lined baking sheet. Keep in the fridge for at least 30 minutes. 3. Preheat oven to 180°C (fan). Place the baking tray in the oven and, after 10 minutes of cooking, place a silicone mat and a wire rack on top. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes. Leave to cool to room temperature. 4. Prepare the patisserie cream. Heat the gelatin mixture. Work the cream through with a spatula, then add the melted gelatin and the two types of vanilla and whisk vigorously. 5. Whip the cream and when it is mousse-like in texture, gently fold it into the pastry cream using a pastry spatula. Seal tightly with cling film and chill in the fridge for 30 minutes. 6. To assemble: cut three 18cm discs in the sheet of mille-feuille. Fill a piping bag and place drops on the outside of the puff pastry. Place a second disc of puff pastry and press lightly, then pipe another 150g of cream in the same way as the first layer. Add the last disc and press down again. Gently dust with icing sugar and decorate with an empty vanilla pod.





COCONUT CAKE

For 8 people - Preparation time: 1 hour 10 mins - Resting time: 7 hours - Cooking time: 50 min

INGREDIENTS: 300g rice pudding - Gelatine paste for coconut mousse: 6g gelatine - 36g water - Shortbread pastry: 130g plain flour -36g icing sugar - 16g ground almonds - 2g salt - 70g butter - 40g eggs - Compressed shortbread: 270g shortbread pastry - 100g hazelnut praline - 80g feuilletine (crushed crêpes gavotte or spun sugar) - 30g coconut oil - 15g ground coconut - Coconut mousse: 240g coconut milk - 45g caster sugar - 30g egg whites - 200g single cream - Garnish: Pieces of shortbread - Ground coconut - Coconut shavings

1. Prepare the gelatine paste for the coconut mousse. In a bowl, whisk together the fish gelatine with cold water. Keep refrigerated for 2 hours. 2. To make the pastry, place the flour, icing sugar, ground almonds and salt in a bowl. Add the cold butter and mix until sandy in texture. Pour in the beaten egg and mix. When the dough is smooth, roll it out to 5mm thickness between two sheets of greaseproof paper. 3. Preheat the oven to 180°C (fan). Place in the oven and bake for 15 to 20 minutes. Leave to cool to room temperature. 4. Grind the shortbread pastry into a powder. Add the praline, coconut powder and feuillantine and mix gently with a spatula until smooth. Add the melted coconut oil and mix again. Pour into a pastry circle and smooth over. Refrigerate for at least 30 minutes until ready to use. 5. Prepare the rice pudding. Pour into a pastry circle and freeze for at least 1 hour. 6. For the coconut mousse, heat the sugar and egg white to 50°C in a bain-marie, then pour the mixture into a bowl and whisk at high speed to obtain a Swiss meringue. Whip the cream until frothy. 7. Heat the gelatine mass in a saucepan, then whisk it into the coconut milk. When the gelled coconut milk reaches 20-25°C, add a small amount of cream and whisk vigorously. Gently fold in the Swiss meringue and finish with the remaining cream. 8. To assemble: fill three quarters of a silicone mould with coconut mousse, add the frozen rice pudding and finish with the rest of the mousse. Smooth and place in the freezer for at least 3 hours. 9. Remove the dessert from the mould, warm it with your hands, and roll it in the ground coconut, tapping to remove any excess. Place the mousse on the shortbread, then add a few pieces of shortbread pastry and coconut shavings.

KOUGLOF

For 1 kouglouf (22cm terracotta kouglof mould) - Preparation time: 50 mins - Resting time: 18 hours - Cooking time: 45 mins

INGREDIENTS: Macerated raisins: 35g water - 100g golden raisins - 1 vanilla pod - Pastry: 250g oatmeal flour + some for the worktop - 100g egg - 40g whole milk - 5g salt - 30g caster sugar - 7g yeast - 75g liquid yeast - 8g orange blossom water (optional) - 100g butter, room temperature + some for greasing - Garnish: 12 whole almonds - 75g clarified butter - Crystallised sugar

THE DAY BEFORE: 1. Bring the water and halved vanilla pod to the boil. Pour over the golden raisins and leave to macerate overnight in an airtight container. SAME DAY: 2. In a bowl, place the eggs, orange blossom water (optional) and milk. Add the oatmeal flour, sugar, salt, baking powder and liquid sourdough. Knead for 5 minutes at a slow speed, then for 6 minutes at medium speed, until the dough pulls away from the sides. Add the macerated raisins and knead a final time until smooth. 3. Form a ball in a lightly floured bowl, cover with a damp cloth and leave to rise at room temperature for about 3 hours. 4. De-aerate the dough, then shape it into a ball and return it to the floured bowl, covered with a cloth. Set aside in the fridge for 1 hour. Generously butter the kouglof mould and place the whole almonds in the indentations. 5. On the lightly floured worktop, roll out the pastry again, then pierce the centre to form a ring to be placed in the mould. Press to release the air and shape to the mould. 6. Preheat the oven to 30°C (fan or natural heat), then turn it off and place the kouglof inside, covered with a damp cloth to rise for at least two hours: it should fill the mould. 7. Preheat the oven to 180 °C (fan). Bake for 35 to 45 minutes. Remove the kouglof from the mould and leave to cool before brushing it with the clarified butter. Finally, roll it in the sugar.



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
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
