
















This is a styling hack rooted in realism...

Bvlgari's Serpenti Seduttori enters a new era with the in-house Lady Solotempo BVS100 movement, blending heritage with horological innovation. As 2025 marks the Year of the Snake, the Maison unveils a timepiece that symbolizes transformation, eternity, and feminine power. Au 750 18K ILGAD

vlgari's Serpenti has never been just a watch – it's a statement. A fusion of Italian artistry, Roman heritage, and relentless innovation, it has remained one of the most recognizable symbols in luxury. Now, in 2025, the Year of the Snake, Bylgari takes Serpenti's evolution a step further. The introduction of the in-house Lady Solotempo BVS100 movement marks a shift - not just in mechanics but in storytelling, craftsmanship, and brand identity. As Bylgari continues to cement its watchmaking legacy, CEO Jean-Christophe Babin reflects on the past decade, the significance of this transformation, and what the future holds for Serpenti.

In conversation with... JEAN-CHRISTOPHE BABIN, CEO Bylgari

Over a decade into your leadership at Bylgari, what stands out as the most defining moment of your tenure? Bylgari is unique because it's more than a jeweler or a watchmaker - it's a universe. We craft jewelry, watches, fragrances, and even hospitality experiences, but my goal has always been to unify these elements under one powerful narrative. That narrative is deeply rooted in Roman history, architecture, and artistry. Over the years, we've refined that vision, making sure that whether you pick up a Bylgari perfume, a Serpenti watch, or a piece of high jewelry, you immediately recognize the essence of the brand. Looking back, one of the most defining moments has been our ability to bring this cohesiveness to life while pushing the boundaries of craftsmanship – whether it's through our record-breaking ultra-thin Octo watches or now, the Lady Solotempo movement

Bylgari continues to evolve while staying true to its heritage. What is your vision for the brand's future, and how do you personally shape its direction? Evolution is part of Bylgari's DNA. Everything we create is inspired by our past but designed for the future. When I joined, many of our product categories felt separate, but I worked to connect them under one story. This approach influenced our watchmaking as well -Serpenti, for example, was always a masterpiece of design, but it lacked an in-house movement. Developing the Lady Solotempo was a natural step forward, reinforcing our credibility as a watchmaker. It's about ensuring that each new creation stays true to Bylgari's spirit while elevating its craftsmanship and desirability.

LVMH Watch Week has become a key industry event. What role does it play for Bvlgari, and what highlights can we expect this year? LVMH Watch Week was born out of necessity but has become a defining moment for us every year. Back in 2018, we launched it because SIHH (now Watches & Wonders) moved their event, which left a gap in the calendar. We realized that January is critical



- retailers and clients need to plan, budgets need to be set, and brands need a strong start to the year. The first edition was small, but today, it has grown to include multiple brands across different markets. This year is the 6th editon and we're hosting events in New York, Paris, and Dubai to ensure global reach. For Bvlgari, it's the perfect moment to showcase our novelties, and in 2025, the focus is on celebrating the Serpenti's mechanical evolution and our broader commitment to high-end watchmaking.

The Middle East has long been a key market for Bvlgari. How does the region inspire the brand, and how has its influence evolved over the years? The Middle East is unlike

any other region – it has an incredible balance of heritage, modernity, and a deep appreciation for craftsmanship. I first came here in 2000 when we were working with Seddiqi, and I still remember sitting on the carpet, drinking coffee, discussing watches. At that time, Sheikh Zayed Road had maybe 15 skyscrapers. Today, Dubai and the entire GCC have transformed into a global luxury hub, with locals, expatriates, and tourists creating a unique market dynamic. What I love about this region is the clientele's appreciation for bold designs, precious materials, and exclusivity. Abu Dhabi is also growing significantly, and we have exclusing plans there as well. The only complaint I hear from the chairman is

that they want more planes to commute faster!

Serpenti is one of Bvlgari's most iconic collections. What inspired the transition to an in-house movement? Serpenti is special because it's not just a ladies' watch – it's a symbol. Since the 1940s, it has continuously evolved, but one thing remained unchanged: its quartz movement. While quartz made sense for wearability, we realized that Serpenti deserved the same level of mechanical prestige as our Octo or high-complication watches. However, the challenge was technical – most automatic movements are round, and Serpenti's case isn't. Developing the Lady Solotempo required designing a movement that would fit seamlessly within the Serpenti form.

Traditionally, many women's timepieces have been adaptations of men's watches. How does Bylgari's approach to designing for women stand apart, and can you share more about your latest

collaboration with Maximilian Büsser? This has been one of my personal frustrations. Many brands take an existing men's watch, reduce the size, add diamonds, and call it a women's timepiece. That's not how we work at Bvlgari. Serpenti was never an adaptation – it was born as a women's watch, inspired by jewelry. Now, we're flipping the script. This year, for the first time, we've created a men's watch inspired by a women's timepiece. Our collaboration with Maximilian Büsser is all about pushing boundaries – it's a true 3D design, celebrating the Year of the Snake with a bold, sculptural approach. It proves that great design transcends gender and that Serpenti's influence extends far beyond traditional expectations.























ou've become synonymous with unforgettable Ramadan performances. How has your journey in Ramadan dramas evolved over the years? I've always been accustomed to working during Ramadan. My first appearance during Ramadan was in the Fawazeer in 2000. Over the past 25 years, I've appeared in series every year, usually with thirty episodes. Throughout these years, I've portrayed a variety of characters. Some works, of course, will always stay with me, as they had a profound impact on society, such as 'Bint Ismaha Zad,' 'Segn El Nesa,' 'Taht al-Saytara,' 'Ikhtifa,' 'L'ala A'la Se'r,' 'Met Wesh,' and 'Faten Amal Harbi.' These were successful projects, each consisting of thirty episodes, and they left a significant mark on Arab drama. With each success, however, my choices have become more challenging.

What can fans expect from this year's series 'My Sisters' and what makes it a story they won't want to miss? The story revolves around four sisters, each with her own life and a unique dreamdreams that are ordinary yet deeply personal. Each sister has her own ambition. However, an unexpected event brings them together. This series falls under the black comedy genre, and although I've had comedic roles in the past, this is my first experience with black comedy. The series features four distinct characters, and we have a wonderful, harmonious team working together."

What was the first thing that made you say, "Yes, I'm in"? Was it the story, the character, or something else that got you excited? First and foremost, it was the opportunity to collaborate with director Mohamed Kamel, and secondly, the script. I truly enjoy working with directors who have a strong presence and a clear vision. While I haven't worked with Mohamed Kamel before, I'm familiar with his work. Some people believe that the script should come before the director, but I disagree. For me, a talented actor chooses a great script, and a strong director brings it to life. My excitement comes from both the colleagues involved and the concept itself. The series consists of 15 episodes, which is more manageable for me, as I've previously worked on 30-episode series that required much more time and effort.

'My Sisters' sees you and Ruby reunited 11 years aler your first collaboraJon in 'Segn El Nesa'. How does it feel to be back together? We worked together on 'Segn El Nesa', but we never actually crossed paths during the production, as each of us had our own separate

evolved over the years? Whether during Ramadan or outside of it, the significant projects I've been part of were often by chance, but I've always chosen good scripts and worked with talented directors. I've had the privilege of collaborating with some of the top directors in the Arab world, such as Kamal Abu Zikri, Tamer Mohsen, Ahmed Madhat, Mando al-Adl, Shawki al-Majri, and director Shaker, among others. I believe a successful series leaves a lasting impact, regardless of whether it's aired during Ramadan. However, Ramadan has a unique atmosphere. It's a 30-day month that everyone eagerly anticipates.

and the series have become an integral part of Ramadan traditions. Many stars truly shine after Light Grey Floral appearing in series during this special time.

Are there any trends or shifts you're especially excited to be part of? As for my view on Arab drama, I believe it's constantly evolving, particularly with the rise of co-productions between Arab countries. This

is fantastic because, despite language differences, our cultures share many similarities. Today, we're seeing Lebanese, Syrian, and Gulf dramas, which bring a unique flavor to the industry. With Saudi Arabia entering the cinema, theater, and drama scenes, this has provided strong support, and the openness is truly exciting. We're now making our mark on the international stage, not just within the Arab world, through films that participate in global festivals. There are many young stars creating remarkable work and showing great talent. Last Ramadan, actress Salma Abu Deif gave an outstanding performance in a project with a first-time director, and it turned out to be a fantastic production. Each year brings new surprises in terms of artistic quality and emerging talent.

What do you think is holding the industry back from reaching its full potential? While there is currently a shortage of strong scripts, we have directors with international experience and a pool of talented actors, which provides all the necessary elements for Arab drama to reach the global stage. The industry is constantly evolving, and I believe the past decade has seen significant advancements in Arabic cinema. Arab drama has transformed from what it used to be, now being produced with a cinematic approach, maintaining high quality, standards, and direction. I expect even more success in the future.

in April 2023, was it your latest launch? What has been the most memorable moment from your recent concerts or tour, and can you share any details about your upcoming album or new music? It's been almost a year that I haven't been touring and I do miss it, but I felt I needed some time to prepare for the next thing. My last show in Paris was memorable, as was Coachella which had a great impact on my life. We also did a few shows in Europe, Amsterdam and London; and all of those moments helped me grow truly from inside as a human.

You mentioned that you are working on something new, can you give us a bit of a hint? For now, I'd like to still keep it under wraps, but for sure it's going to be real and authentic. But as I said, I'm still in the process and to be honest I don't even know the exact outcome myself.

What initially attracted you to Chanel, and how has your partnership with the brand developed over time? Over time it's really getting better and better as we're getting to know each other more and working more closely with the team. I really love working with Chanel, it's been a few years now and there's always a surprise and something new to look forward to. It's like a dream, and there's always a little moment when I have to pinch myself and tell myself


> Is there a specific Chanel piece that you personally love or feel connected to?

The Palestinian-Chilean singer on making music, the importance of representing her roots and how her closet is just brimming with Keffiyehs...

You're known for your incredible stage presence. What's going through your mind before you step on stage, and how do you tap into that energy to perform? Since I was a little girl, being able to perform was what inspired me to make music. I feel it shows the rawest form of an artist. Behind the scenes, I

challenge myself in my rehearsals and the process of producing. But it's part of my growth. I use all of this work as a tool, so that the second I step on stage, I can be free to improvise and feel what feels most natural. I surprise myself on stage, it's exciting!! Before going on stage, I make sure I'm surrounded by people that I love and we pray. I have a ritual of intentions with Yanna's Angels, and then I just enjoy the stage.

Take us back to the first time you performed in front of an audience. What was that experience like for you, and how did it shape who you are as a performer today? The first time I performed was at school in 4th grade. It was a duet with my friend. She forgot the lyrics, so I took the lead from there. I learned to accept that things could go wrong on stage, but the real test is how do you handle it. I started performing at such a young age in my hometown, Nazareth, which definitely helped me get a lot more experience. Just being at home performing in the living room, and making my own performances for 6 hours a day helped me understand what I'm capable of when it comes to the stage.

Do you have a specific time or routine when you sit down to create, or are you someone who lets inspiration strike whenever and wherever it hits you? I feel like I collect inspiration from the world; from different cultures, places, people. So when it's time to make music, my

brother, Fairdose, and I, take everything that we experienced into the studio. I commit to every phase of my career with all of my heart. When it's time to perform, we are perfecting the show; taking care of every detail. When it's album time, we commit to that process and go into the world even deeper; thinking of how we want the entire story/project to be.

You've navigated the music industry with a strong sense of identity. Has there been a moment when you felt like you had to fight to stay true to yourself and your vision?

Being authentic is the most important thing for me as an artist. It's different and relative to everyone of us, and I think of the bigger picture because I feel art comes from something unknown. We are just a vessel to spread these messages that are expressed through us and I'm happily performing them in my own way. There is no right or wrong in this. As long as you expand and allow new ideas to come to you.

Let's talk about style, you've got such a unique take on it there's a sense of modern edge, but also a deep connection to

> tradition and spirit. How would you describe it? I'd say my style matches my music. For me, style and music go hand in hand. Being able to express myself and my culture with how I dress is fun and experimental. There are elements to my style, and I love to go deeper in the details of it as well. Especially creating with my sister, Tali. We have a connection in fashion, we love to explore and create things from scratch, the process is detailed and fun. Also, seeing my fans coming to my shows rocking all of these elements makes us feel like we are in a new universe that I can't wait to expand!

You're often seen donning a Keffiyeh. How many Keffiyehs do you think you own? I have so many! What do you expect from a Proud Pali girl? I gotta represent always. I have a collection of so many beautiful ones that I got as gifts from my fans. They get really creative with the embroidery on them. They add coins and really cool elements to them.

How important is it to you to rep

your roots? Being proud of my roots

simply comes natural to me. It's who I am, and it's organically in my art, my music, my dancing and my looks. It's my identity and I make sure that every place I go to, I introduce them to it. For this Coach shoot, how do you see your styles meshing? And what was your favorite look from the shoot? It's a mixture between simple and creative. I loved the freedom and how smooth the

combination was between both worlds. My favorite look was where we used pink, cool cars and coins as hair accessories.

Your collab with Coldplay has been on repeat everywhere since it dropped. How was that whole experience for you? It's been such a special experience that made me grow and learn so much as a young artist. I'm forever grateful for them.

Anyone else you would just love to make music with? Who's on your collab list? MIA is someone I would love to collab with.

Arab artists representing the cultural diversity of the Middle East region are bringing new perspectives to Art Paris 2025 this year. Capturing social and cultural shifts through art, photographs, installations, and experimental animations, the resulting dialogue is all set to stir up a sensational awakening, or rather, a much-needed re-awakening.

Embracing Identity, Culture E Heritage


he 27th edition of Art Paris is set to return in April this year, celebrating modern and contemporary art, and attracting over 170 exhibitors from 25 countries. As one of the most highly anticipated art fairs in Europe, this edition brings with it a befitting spotlight on the conversations emerging from the Arab world. "In 2018, it was one of the first art fairs in Europe to

> host a platform dedicated to the Saudi art scene, in collaboration with the Misk Foundation," recalls Guillaume Piens, Director of Art Paris. "This year, we look forward to welcoming Lebanese participants such as Tanit and Saleh Barakat, as well as the Kuwait-based gallery Hunna Art, which exclusively showcases female talent from the region,"

he says. The program includes two main themes: Immortal: A Focus on Figurative Painting in France, curated by Amélie Adamo and Numa Hambursin, and Out of Bounds, curated by Simon Lamunière, featuring works that shed light on the intersection of culture, heritage, personal memory, and collective history.

Shown for the first time outside of Saudi Arabia, is the stunning installation 'Neuma: The Forgotten Ceremony' by Saudi-American artist Sarah Brahim and French artist, Ugo Left: Galerie Tanit, Humming birds over my city 2022, Zena Assi

Schiavi. First unveiled in AlUla as part of the Villa Hegra prefiguration program it pays homage to the rituals of the pre-Islamic tribes, and is inspired by the AlUla's mythology, heritage, and archaeology. Another prominent feature is 'Out of Bounds' which presents a curated selection of 18 international artists, including female Arab artists that are daring to push the limits of understanding, offering new perspective on identity, power, and belonging. "Many artists will also be represented by European galleries, including Saudi artist Mohammad AlFarraj by Mennour, Lebanese artist Zena Assi by Tanit, and Iraqi-origin artist Sama

Alshaibi by Esther Woerdehoff Gallery, whose work challenges stereotypes of Arab women," adds Piens. Bringing forward the importance of multi-ethnicity, cross-cultural influences, and cultural hybridization, this year's fair is an invitation for deeper reflection on cultural acceptance, and awareness.

With 'Out of Bounds' Simon Lamunière curates based on themes of origins, gender, history and geography. From Kuwait, artists Raya Kassisieh, Razan AlSarraf, and Nour Elbasuni explore social and cultural differences, while from Beirut, Zena Assi highlights shared human experiences. "Through painting, sculpture, animation, and installation, my work delves into themes of migration, war, gender, identity, and social change. By documenting and reflecting on cultural and social shifts in the Arab world - particularly in Beirut - while drawing from my own journey, I seek to foster cross-cultural understanding and appreciation between East and West, discussions among diverse audiences, and bridging cultural divides," she says.

Meanwhile, Iraqi-artist Sama Alshaibi uses photographs to drive her rather bold message forward. "I'm interested in the societal impact of unequal power relations between the West and the Middle East, and how that domination is articulated through photographs," she says. This collective representation of female Arab artists from the Middle East is sure to leave a lasting impact that begs for a reawakening of sensitivities which serve to foster peace, unity and restoration.

Preserving and safeguarding ancient archaeology and artifacts found here, this UNESCO-nominated world heritage site is a marvel that blends the best of the past, and presents a modern-day engagement and education experience. Just a 45-minute drive from Dubai, you can explore everything either on horse-back, a self-driven buggy, or a 4x4 to tour the vast 34 square kilometre desert expanse that is fenced and protected. With Sharjah being recognized as the cultural capital of the Arab World in 1998 by UNESCO, the immersive and experiential destination of the Mleiha National Park is one that aligns with this position, holding within it stories from over 200,000 years of



human history preserved at archaeological sites such as the Jebel Buhais, the ancient tombs of Umm an-Nar, the valley of the caves, Fossil Rock and more. The archaeological museum displays pre-historic tools used for hunting and made from flint, while it also showcases how trade took place within the settlements at Mleiha and with the rest of the world that followed the Silk Road trade routes. With each artifact and section of the museum revealing much about each pre-historic periods, its culture, landscape, and heritage, there's also plenty of evidence linked to burial rituals, pottery, ancient coins, pearl adornments and jewelry, extinct animals unique to the region, marine fossils, rock formations dating back 93 million years, and lots more.

With sustainability at the heart of it all, the Mleiha National Park which is developed and managed by the Sharjah Investment Development Authority (Shurooq), ensures ecofriendly activities, events, and experiences that blend adventure, history, and heritage. Think natural habitat and wildlife, where flora and fauna add to the rich stories of the region where settlements once thrived, and the rare chance to catch the Arabian red fox, and desert gazelles. Offering views of the Hajjar mountains, it also boasts of vantage points atop the red sand dunes where one can enjoy the glorious sunrise and sunset. For those seeking adventure, there's paragliding, sand surfing, dune bashing, hiking and trekking, guided tours, stargazing, horseback riding, as well as glamping options.

The recent success of the Tanweer Festival which took place in November is a testament to the popularity of this gem in Sharjah's crown, and with it all set to return at the end of this year again, it looks to be a promising event that will attract visitors from all over the world.

RADISH ROSES AND BUTTERED BREAD

by JEAN-FRANÇOIS PIÈGE

Serves 4 - Preparation time: 20 mins - Cooking time: 8 mins

100g BUCKWHEAT BREAD - 40g BUTTER - 100g MASCARPONE - 8 ROUND RADISHES - FLEUR DE SEL

1. Cut thin slices of bread with a leaf-shaped cookie cutter. Toast them between two baking sheets in the oven at 180°C/gas mark 6 for 2 minutes. 2. Brown the butter in a frying pan until it takes on an amber color. Immediately transfer to a bowl and set aside. 3. Add the mascarpone to the cooled browned butter, stir to melt, and season with salt. Wash and dry the radishes, cut into thin strips, and shape into flowers. 4. Place a small amount of mascarpone on the toasted bread sheets, followed by a radish flower. Sprinkle with fleur de sel. Serve immediately.





1. Fry the tarragon in the melted butter for 1 minute. Pour over the breadcrumbs, season with salt and pepper, and mix well. Set aside for 24 hours. 2. Brown the chicken, then bake for 40 minutes at 180 °C/gas mark 6. 3. Thinly slice the shallot. Mix with the chopped garlic, bay leaf, thyme, tarragon, pepper, and vinegar. Reduce by three quarters. Add the seeded and diced tomatoes and continue cooking the sauce for 30 minutes. Remove the tarragon, thyme, and bay leaf. Finally pour in the chicken jus.

4. Five minutes before the chicken has finished cooking, brush with mustard and sprinkle with breadcrumbs. Once fully cooked, serve with the sauce.





POLLACK À LA VIGNERONNE

Serves 4 - Preparation time: 25 mins - Cooking time: 20 mins

4 FILLETS OF POLLACK, 150g SKINNED - 250g COOKED MUSHROOM MIX (CHANTERELLES, GIROLLES, TROMPETTES, BUTTON MUSHROOMS) - 30g BUTTER - FOR THE SAUCE VIGNERONNE: 300g LOOSE BLACK GRAPES - 50cl RED CŌTES-DU-RHŌNE - 3 SHALLOTS, THINLY SLICED - 50cl FISH STOCK - 50cl MEAT JUICE - 1 Hosp. SHALLOT CONFIT PURĒE - 1 Hosp. CHERRY

1. In a saucepan, combine all the ingredients for the sauce vigneronne, except the butter, and reduce by two-thirds until the mixture coats the spoon. Strain, reserving the grape stalks for decoration. Add the butter, season, and keep warm. 2. Season the pollock with salt and pepper. Melt the butter in a frying pan until golden brown. Fry the pollack for about 3 minutes on each side over medium heat, basting regularly. When the fillets are cooked, set them aside in a dish and add the mushrooms to the pan. Season and keep warm. 3. Divide the mushrooms and pollack between 4 plates, then top with the sauce vigneronne. For decoration, poke small button mushrooms onto the grape stalks.



TERIYAKI CHICKEN

Serves 4 - Preparation time: 40 mins - Cooking time: 1 hour 45 mins

2 CHICKEN FILLETS - SALTED SOY SAUCE - WHITE SESAME SEEDS - FOR THE POTATO TATIN: 8 AGATHA POTATOES -100G SUGAR - 90G MIRIN - 10G SWEET SOY SAUCE - 30g BUTTER - FOR THE CEBETTE PESTO: 2 BUNCHES OF SPRING ONIONS - 20g SLIVERED ALMONDS - OLIVE OIL - FOR THE GINGER SAUCE: 100g WHITE ONION- 100g GARLIC - 50g FRESH GINGER - 40g SALTED SOY SAUCE - FOR THE GOMASIO: 5g FLEUR DE SEL - 10g BLACK AND WHITE SESAME SEEDS

1. Drizzle soy sauce onto the meat fillets, then sear in binchotan (Japanese charcoal). Once the skin has caramelized, glaze the fillets with soy sauce and sprinkle with sesame seeds. Finish cooking in a dish for 8 minutes in the oven at 170 °C/gas mark 5-6. Leave to rest for 5 minutes, then cut into fillets. 2. For the Tatin, make a caramel by mixing the sugar, mirin and soy sauce. Pour it into the bottom of an ovenproof dish. Peel the potatoes, slice thinly, salt the slices, and mix with the melted butter. In the dish, layer the potato slices over the caramel. Place a weight on top and bake for 1 hour at 170°C/gas mark 5-6. Leave to cool with the weight on top, then cut up the Tatin. 3. For the pesto, trim the greens from the spring onions, then blanch in boiling water. Drain and leave to cool. Blend the white of the spring onions, the blanched green, the almonds, and a pinch of salt. Add a thin drizzle of olive oil, mix, and set aside. 4. For the ginger sauce, sauté the peeled and minced onion, garlic and ginger. Deglaze with soy sauce and cook, covered. Once cooked, blend together. Crush the fleur de sel and sesame seeds in a mortar to obtain gomasio. Arrange neatly on the plate.






WHITE BEAN CAKE

by MICHEL AND SÉBASTIEN BRAS

Serves 4 - Preparation time: 25 mins - Rest time: Overnight + 2 hours 30 mins - Cooking time: 1 hour 30 mins

4 BLACK FIGS - HALF A LEMON - GINGER - OLIVE OIL - 1 tbsp. CANDIED ORANGE PEEL - FOR THE ORANGE COULIS: 120g SUGAR - 28cl ORANGE JUICE - 80g BUTTER - FOR THE CAKE: 300g WHITE BEANS - 2 GELATINE LEAVES - 10cl UHT CREAM - 1 VANILLA POD, SPLIT - 100g BUTTER - 80g IVOIRE WHITE CHOCOLATE - 25g POWDERED SUGAR

1. Soak the white beans in a large bowl of water the day before. The next day, cook them in salted water and mash. Strain through a sieve until you have 500g of pulp. 2. Soak the gelatine in a bowl of water. Bring 5cl of cream to the boil, and leave the vanilla pod to infuse for 10 minutes. 3. In the bowl of a mixer, combine the bean purée with the vanilla cream, partially melted butter, chocolate, and powdered sugar. Blend thoroughly. Set aside in a cool place. 4. When slightly stiffened, whip the remaining cream and gently fold into the mixture. Pour into a terrine and chill for 2 hours. 5. In a saucepan, caramelize the sugar and soften it with a little water. Add the orange juice and infuse for 5 minutes. Add the butter and cook for 3 to 4 minutes. Set the coulis aside. 6. Wash the figs, cross-cut the ends to a depth of 3cm, and open them slightly. Grate a pinch of ginger inside, squeeze a few drops of lemon, and drizzle with olive oil. Bake for 15 minutes at 140°C/gas mark 4-5, until the figs are tender. Set aside. 7.Cut the terrine into sticks measuring 12 x 4 x 3 cm. Place a stick and a roasted fig on each plate for decoration. Drizzle with the caramelized orange coulis and sprinkle with candied orange zest.





Serves 4 - Preparation time: 30 mins - Standing time: Overnight - Cooking time: 1 hour

FOR THE CHANTILLY: 250g SINGLE CREAM - 25g SUGAR - 25g SAGE - 75g MASCARPONE - FOR THE SYRUP: 100g WATER - 50g CASTER SUGAR - 1 ORGANIC RUBINETTE APPLE - FOR THE MERINGUE: 3 EGG WHITES - 133g CASTER SUGAR (1) - 2g WHITE VINEGAR - 17g CASTER SUGAR (2) - 2.5g CORN STARCH - FOR THE DECORATION: 2 ORGANIC RUBINETTE APPLES - BUTTER

1. Heat the cream with sugar and sage, blend, strain, and add the cold mascarpone. Leave the whipped cream to stand overnight in a cool place. 2. Boil the water with the sugar, then leave to cool. Cut 12 thin slices of granny smith apple and leave to marinate in the syrup overnight. 3. The next day, whisk the egg whites with the caster sugar (1). When the meringue has thickened, add the vinegar, then the caster sugar (2) and cornstarch. Using a tablespoon, form balls on a baking sheet and bake for 55 minutes at 102°C/gas mark 3. The meringue should be crisp on the outside and soft on the inside. 4. Whip the cream with in a stand mixer. Cut a Rubinette apple into wedges and brown in a knob of butter. Divide the meringue balls between four plates, cover with chantilly, and place 3 or 4 wedges of roasted apple on top. Finally, roll up the apple slices and place them on top of the cream.

ST. HONORE CAKE

Serves 4 - Preparation time: 1 hour 30 mins - Chilling time: 8 hours - Cooking time: 1 hour 20 mins

500G PUFF PASTRY -POWDERED SUGAR - FOR THE GANACHE: 75G CHESTNUT PASTE - 250G FULL-FAT CREAM - 35G WHITE CHOCOLATE - FOR THE CHOUX PASTRY: 125G MILK - 1/2 TSP FINE SALT - A PINCH OF BROWN SUGAR - 110G BUTTER - 140G FLOUR - 225G EGGS (3 TO 4 EGGS) - FOR THE CHANTILLY: 400G FULL-FAT CREAM - 50G CHESTNUT PASTE - 100G CHESTNUT CREAM - FOR THE CARAMEL: 200G SUGAR - FOR THE DECORATION: CHESTNUTS IN SYRUP

1. Place the chantilly ingredients in a cool place the day before. For the ganache, mix the chestnut paste with the cream and bring to a gentle boil. Pour over the chocolate and stir until melted. Refrigerate for 8 hours. 2. The next day, prepare the choux pastries. Preheat oven to 180°C/gas mark 6. Boil the milk with 125g water, salt, brown sugar and butter, then stir. Once off the heat, pour in the flour all at once, mix vigorously, and let the dough dry for a minute on low heat. Remove from the heat and gradually add the eggs. Using a pastry bag fitted with a 7mm pastry tip, pipe the puffs on a greased baking sheet. Bake for 20 minutes.

3. Prepare the base of the saint-honoré. Roll out the puff pastry to a thickness of 2mm. Bake for 10 minutes at 180°C/gas mark 6 between two baking trays. Cut a 22 cm diameter circle in the pastry, place between two baking sheets and bake for 30 minutes at 160°C/gas mark 5-6. Remove the top baking sheet, sprinkle with powdered sugar and bake for 3 minutes at 180°C/gas mark 6. Leave to cool. 4. Prepare the whipped cream. Mix all the cooled ingredients, then whip in a stand mixer. 5 Beat the saint-honoré. Whip the ganache. Score the underside of the choux and fill with ganache using a piping bag. 5. Prepare the caramel with sugar and 50g water, then dip the choux in it. Cover the puff pastry with the ganache, sprinkle with chestnuts in syrup, and arrange most of the choux around the edge of the cake. Fill the cake with chantilly using a pastry bag fitted with a sainthonoré tip. Decorate with the remaining choux and chestnuts. Tip: To make homemade chestnut paste, bring 40g sugar and 40g water to the boil. Blend with 250g cooked chestnuts and a little vanilla until you get a paste-like consistency.

Origin Circle's wellness philosophy? We keep it simple and nourishing. Our menu is health-conscious but full of variety – salads, bowls, sandwiches, smoothies, and desserts that actually taste good. We use whole, unprocessed ingredients, naturally sweetening our desserts with dates and honey instead of refined sugar, and our yogurt bowls are made with full-fat, homemade yogurt because real food always wins over low-fat substitutes.

We also know that everyone has different dietary needs, so we offer options to make meals work for you – whether you're vegetarian, keto, gluten-free, or just figuring out what feels best. We don't list calories because we're not about restriction – we're about balance and intuitive eating. Eat well, listen to your body, and enjoy your food without overthinking it.

If there's one misconception about wellness or fitness you'd love to debunk, what would it be? The "more is better" mentality is deeply ingrained in fitness and wellness, but it often does more harm than good. True progress comes from smart, intentional training and recovery. Many believe that multiple workouts a day, heavier weights, or pushing to exhaustion will yield better results, but this often leads to stress, injuries, and burnout. The same applies to recovery – staying in a cold plunge longer or lowering the temperature isn't necessarily more effective. Wellness isn't about extremes; it's about balance. Our bodies are incredibly intuitive, and the key is learning to listen and work with them, not against them.

As founders, what's your personal wellness routine like? Do any of the offerings at Origin Circle align with your personal practices? Everything we offer at Origin aligns with our personal practices. We've been asked to introduce workouts purely for business reasons, but we only add what we truly believe in and love doing ourselves.

Farah: I alternate between Lagree and hot Pilates, enjoy sauna sessions three times a week, and challenge myself with a cold plunge at least once every other week to build mental resilience. Yoga is something I'd like to practice more of! While Origin isn't a traditional training gym, I also make sure to fit in strength training three times a week. Building muscle is especially important for women as we age.

Michelle: Coming from years of excessive HIIT workouts that over-stressed my body, in the last year, I've switched my routine to only low-impact. Lagree and strength training have always been part of my routine, but most recently I've been prioritizing our hot mat pilates and yoga classes to work on my breathing, flexibility, and joint health.


