





ur cover star Ayça Aylin Turan leads October with range, focus, and a kind of ease that suits the season. On set and in conversation, she moves between roles and real life without the drama, proof that clarity can feel powerful. That spirit sets the pace for the issue: strong edits, real craft, and stories that land.

Fashion splits cleanly this month. One path is all about precision: monochrome looks, sharp structure, and quiet details that do the work. The other goes brighter: blocks of color, smart layers, and pieces made for weekends and short escapes. Power dressing stays practical; off-duty is relaxed but intentional. The aim is wearability without noise. Jewelry takes center frame and we go behind the bench to show how pieces come to life – braided metalwork, hand-set stones, mirror polish, pavé fields, and stacks that move from day to night. And because balance is real life, we've included health guidance for busy seasons that are practical, expert-led, and easy to apply. As for adventure, our travel notes touch down in Bucharest and Mexico for short, workable escapes.





Chanel's Fall-Winter 2025/26 Ready-to-Wear rewrites proportion, perspective, and house codes

Under the Grand Palais glass roof, Chanel's Creation Studio delivered a study in scale for Fall–Winter 2025/26. Mini blue-white-pink tweed jackets meet extra-long trousers; ankle-grazing poplin shirts reset shirting; a short black tweed jacket reads as a coatdress with jeweled buttons; capes finish in jacket cuffs. House codes (bows, ribbons, pearls, flowers) are resized

across ready-to-wear and accessories.

Layering drives the silhouette. A grenadine tweed trio pairs a micro-jacket (redsilk lined), wrap skirt, and flared trousers; bronze looks add a tunic and trousers with a skirt buttoned over; an ivory long-slit skirt sits under a miniskirt and

sleeveless gilet. Sheer pieces – flounced capes and long shirts in black or white tulle – create movement. Fabric experiments include chiffon "jeans," silk woven to read like tweed, ribbon-print silks, and a black organza parka set with bows.

















ome bags are accessories; others become confidantes. Schiaparelli's Secret, first unveiled in 2023, belongs to the latter. This season, Daniel Roseberry offers a new chapter to the story by introducing softer silhouettes, supple leathers, and playful brass details that feel just as suited to morning errands as they do to evening rendezvous.

At its heart, the Secret still carries Elsa Schiaparelli's signature padlock clasp, a whimsical emblem first created in 1935. Reimagined today, it safeguards not just what's inside but the spirit of intrigue the



enough for daytime wear, striking enough for evening entrances.



Maison is known for. Worn crossbody with denim and boots, it channels western cool; tucked under the arm in black grain leather, it becomes pure Parisian chic. Identity, Unfiltered

For Calvin Klein FW25, Lughass turns the lookbook into a dialogue with local creatives and real presence. Denim anchors a study in authenticity over artifice.

CALVIN KLEIN FW25: A STRIPPED-BACK LENS ON IDENTITY BY LUGHASS

Calvin Klein's FW25 collection isn't about excess or ornamentation - it's about elevating the ordinary into something extraordinary. Essentials are pared back yet powerful, embracing contradiction with a quiet confidence. And who better to capture that spirit than UAE-based photographer Ghassan Luqman, better known as Lughass, whose lens has become synonymous with raw authenticity and cultural storytelling in the region.

For this project, Lughass flipped the lookbook on its head. Instead of polished perfection, he sought out something more human - an honest reflection on identity itself. Ten local creatives were invited to embody the collection, each encouraged to choose the looks that felt most natural to them. The cast was as diverse as it was dynamic: architect Amar Sibai, model-actress Lana Albeik, models Junaynah El Guthmy and Mai Yackout, entrepreneur Farah Assad, creative consultant Haya Abdullah, along with Lughass himself stepping in front of the camera. Joining them were photographer-artist Omar Sha3, DJ Karrouhat, and filmmaker Omar Al Mehri. Together, they became the fabric of the story.

Makeup was kept minimal, the styling unforced. Denim - cut to fit like a second skin - anchored the looks, while cotton sweaters in jewel tones, crisp poplin shirts, and understated polos brought structure and contrast. The iconic CK logo, subtly reimagined across knits and tees, offered a nod to heritage while signalling a bold new direction.

"The fashion world is sometimes seen as flat, even superficial," Lughass reflects. "I wanted to prove that fashion can be a dialogue, not a monologue. By inviting real people into the frame - people with stories, contradictions, and presence - Calvin Klein became not just clothing, but a

The result is more than a lookbook. It is a mirror of the Arab diaspora's layered identities: different yet connected, stripped back yet expressive. With denim at the core, Calvin Klein's FW25 collection doesn't just dress the body, it speaks to the complexity of the people wearing it.



Laure Cérède centers on purpose: precise lines, clear messages, and design that honours the Maison's heritage while addressing the present. That philosophy shapes LOVE Unlimited, the flexible, second-skin evolution of the 1969 LOVE bracelet. Engineered from roughly 200 miniaturised components with a patent-pending, screw-operated invisible clasp, it keeps the signature screw motif and introduces a connectable, ergonomic construction - made to be worn solo, stacked, or linked for a continuous ribbon of gold.



You've been at the creative helm of Cartier's jewelery and watchmaking for some time now. Can you tell us about your journey with the Maison and how your creative vision has evolved within its rich heritage? I love this job; it's incredible. I feel extremely lucky, this place is amazing. The work is a passion, and the people I work with are not only talented but kind. I'm speaking for the entire design team at Cartier: we share this passion and a sense of honor in serving the Maison. I rejoined about 10 years ago, wholeheartedly. As Creative Director, you must stretch yourself to meet what the Maison needs and that's exactly what I love to do. As for evolution, you sometimes return to the past to renew it. Over time I've become more precise and more particular in design. Today, it's not only about form; it's about meaning, ensuring each design carries a clear message.


Cartier's DNA is rooted in bold innovation and timeless elegance. As Creative Director, how do you strike the balance between preserving the brand's legacy and pushing creative boundaries? Finding the balance is challenging. Our work often falls into two paths: one that honors heritage and one that pursues new creation. But creation is everywhere, especially with icons people already know. A truly new product is demanding too. For us, each piece is about design, concept, and technical development; the challenge is how to realize the drawing we imagine.

The new flexible LOVE bracelet is a true feat of design and engineering, with over 100 prototypes created. From rigid symbolism to a flowing embrace, what does this evolution in design reveal about

Cartier's interpretation of love today? When we think about love, we can't allow ourselves to fail, we must get it right. We asked what love means today. For me, at Cartier, it's not just a jewel; it is an object of design. The symbolic value matters even more than pure aesthetics. We wanted to translate the feeling - the sensations - into something contemporary. With the new LOVE bracelet, we aimed for a second-skin effect. It's not about erasing the original bangle but complementing it. The existing bangle is a rigid declaration, a symbol of commitment; today, we also speak to self-love and self-closure.

What were the biggest creative and technical challenges in reinventing such an iconic piece, and how did you define the target audience for this collection? We

deconstructed the original bangle, which was not easy. The idea of a self-closing screw was key: we wanted a piece that a woman could put on easily while preserving the LOVE bracelet's meaning - the act of opening and closing it yourself. Stacking is part of the tradition; in our visuals, we see men and women layering pieces. That felt modern and contemporary, and we designed with that in mind.







apprenticeship in Geneva. It is a modest start that sets

the tone: learn carefully, share what you know, and keep

improving. In 1819 a new partner, François Constantin, writes a line that becomes the house's compass: "Do better if possible, and that is always possible." The early years show how practical changes can reshape an industry. In 1839, Georges-Auguste Leschot develops a pantograph that standardizes parts, so watches can be built and serviced with more consistency. Accuracy moves from theory to daily wear in 1907 with the Chronomètre Royal. By 1932, a collaboration with the watchmaker Louis Cottier yields a world-time display that shows 24 time zones at once - useful for travelers then and now. None of this is loud. All of it makes life

easier for the person wearing the watch.

BY DESIGN

Alongside these technical steps, craft remains the constant. Movement components are finished by hand, even when no one will see them once assembled. Enameling, engraving, guillochage, and gem-setting are kept in the workshops so technique isn't decoration after the fact; it is the method from the start. That is why an ultra-thin minute repeater from the 1940s and a modern open-worked calibre feel related. Design follows real needs rather than trends. The American 1921, launched for the U.S. market, tilts its dial so the time is easier to read at a glance; a century later it still feels fresh because it solved a simple problem. Jewelry-led pieces prove that sparkle and substance can share the same case. Special commissions for royals and collectors push complication counts when asked, yet the quieter work keeps the brand grounded: slimmer movements, cleaner dials and dependable chronometry.

250th brings Tour de l'Île, a double-sided wristwatch with 16 complications that remains readable and coherent. Ten years later, Reference 57260 sets a new benchmark with 57 functions. These peaks matter because they raise the floor: if a manufacture can build at the limit, it can build the everyday with more confidence and ease. Partnerships with museums and artists add context, while Métiers d'art pieces use the dial to tell cultural and scientific stories. Through it all, the same habits hold: teach the next person, keep the details tight, and let

In conversation with... AYÇA AYŞIN TURAN

It's our October cover - what energy are you stepping into this season? Autumn always reminds me of rebirth. I'm entering this season with a loving energy, one where I can hear my own voice more clearly, and with peace, happiness, and health.

In Prada: how do the clothes change your posture, your voice, your presence? Being a Prada woman is not just a fashion choice – it's a way of being. When you wear Prada, the sharpness of the design gives you clarity, but at the same time it brings a sophisticated calm. I notice my posture straightens naturally, my gaze becomes more determined, and even my voice sounds more assured. But it's not about "becoming someone else." On the contrary, it's about revealing a side of myself that's always been there, waiting in the shadows. For me, fashion is not a mask - it's a mirror. And Prada shows me that reflection more clearly.

What's one look from the shoot that surprised you, and why did it work on you? The red jacket look stood out to me during the shoot. It carried both elegance and confidence, and I loved how it instantly elevated my presence in front of the camera.

From your various film and TV roles, what do you think audiences most consistently connect with in you? I think it's authenticity and naturalness. When I play a character, I never think, "How should I look?" Instead, I ask myself, "What is this character really feeling?" I believe the audience senses that sincerity. For me, one of cinema's greatest powers is empathy. That's the bridge between me and the audience. I want viewers to feel that the characters I bring to life remind them of someone or something in their own world. That's when the character and the audience's world merge.

In your latest lead, what new muscle did you build (discipline, stillness, range, or pace) and how will you carry it forward? Recently, I've played very different roles, and that's incredibly valuable for an actor. Each one taught me something unique - from embodying the emotions of someone visually impaired, to Vicdan, to a woman deceived by love and trapped in her own personal hell. I also learned that silence can be just as powerful as words. There's an entire world inside quietness, with so much to express. The more characters you bring to life, the richer your garden becomes.

When you choose a project, what's your "yes" test? The story, and the place of the character within that story. That harmony is very important to me. The empathy we hope to create with the audience begins with ourselves. Sometimes the script reflects emotions you've never personally experienced – but while reading, you still recognize them deep inside, and you embrace them. That's when the connection between character and actor begins.

In Vicdansız, you portray Vicdan. In a story built around memory and identity, what did this role make you reflect on personally? Since the series hasn't aired yet, it's honestly hard to share without giving spoilers. But it's a project I fell in love with, and one I enjoyed portraying immensely. On an emotional level, it reminded me that life is fleeting – and that the moments we often dismiss as ordinary, or fail to notice because of our ambitions and distractions, can in fact be incredibly precious. Sometimes we only realize the value of those moments much later. Vicdan also taught me that identity is never a single, perfect whole - it's the sum of fragments, gaps, and even scars.

In Al Beni Baba, Nazlı's journey is marked by desperation and family bonds. Which scene moved you the most while portraying her? Again, since the film hasn't been released vet, I can't go into detail. What moved me most was knowing that this is not just the story of one young woman, but of thousands of real people. Hearing the silent screams behind silence, feeling the depth of unspoken despair, and empathizing with that reality affected me deeply. I believe the audience will feel the same, and I truly hope this story can reach someone who needs it.

Today Is Beautiful stands out as a lighter, hopeful project compared to your dramatic roles. How was this shift for you as an actress? It was a joyful shift for me. I play Günes, a nurse full of life who reminds her patients - and herself - that life is worth living, no matter the hardships. She works to heal others, to help them feel better, even while facing her own struggles. Through her, I was reminded that life is made up of both bitter and sweet emotions - but what matters is how you face them, and how you choose to keep moving forward.

Confidence on set versus confidence in life: where do they overlap, where don't they? Confidence is a whole. If you keep it alive, it's reflected in every part of life. You can be indecisive, you can make mistakes - but no matter what, your confidence is what gives you the strength to keep going. Confidence is like an actor's armor. It's your belief in the character you're creating. You own it, protect it - and that transforms the abstract into something concrete in front of the camera. The audience feels that energy.

A note to your younger self at your first audition - what would it say? First, I'd give her a hug. Then I'd say: Don't ever lose that spark in your eyes. Don't be afraid of making mistakes - your rights and wrongs are what shape you. Learn from your mistakes, and no matter what, always keep moving forward.

Style off duty: three pieces that are basically your uniform right now... An oversized shirt, jeans, and sneakers. It might sound very simple, but it makes me feel both comfortable and free. My style is actually tied to my sense of freedom.

What's your five-minute reset on a long day? Just being alone with myself – in complete silence – doing nothing, just listening inward.

When you're short on time, how do you get your body moving? I have a quick five-minute routine that combines stretching and energizing exercises. When my time is short. I do this and welcome the day.

When people close the magazine after this story, what do you hope lingers? My sincerity. It's something I never want to lose, no matter what. It's also a vital part of the empathy bridge I build with the audience. That sincerity is what defines me, and it's where I connect with them. After this interview, I hope the trace that lingers in their hearts is

IN HER WORDS..

THE HUMAN

Lynn Al Khatib, Chalhoub Group's VP of Communications and an accredited executive coach, turns big ideas into human stories. She backs women, bets on trust, and keeps "less is more" at the center

You've moved from nutrition labs to leading communications at a luxury powerhouse. At first glance, they seem worlds apart - what's the red thread that ties your journey together? They do sound like two different planets, don't they? But for me, the red thread has always been human connection. Whether I was translating nutrition science into language people could trust, or now shaping stories for a luxury powerhouse, it's the same mission: taking something complex and making it meaningful. And let's be honest - both science and corporate comms have a reputation

for being 'serious.' I've always loved sneaking in creativity, simplicity, and a little fun into areas people might otherwise call 'boring.'

Many in your position would stop at being VP of Communications for a luxury leader. But you stepped into executive coaching. What was the moment you knew you had more to give? I've always been in the world of coaching and leadership. Back at Nestlé, I was part of the internal coaching and training pool, and later, at Chalhoub, I found myself constantly guiding my own team - sometimes as a teacher, sometimes as a mentor, and often as a coach, depending on where they were in their journey. It became second nature to flex between those roles. So, getting accredited as an Executive Coach wasn't a career pivot - it was the natural next step. For me, there's never a "stop" to growth. Titles don't mean much if you don't have a growth plan year after year. Coaching simply gave me the tools and structure to do what I've always loved: helping leaders see themselves more clearly and unlock their potential.


Your 'Wave Method' teaches leaders to turn life's highs and lows into fuel for growth. What was your own defining wave - a high or a low - that shaped you most deeply? The Wave Method is really how I coach and

guide executives, because life is a wave - it lifts you up, pushes you forward, and sometimes pulls you under. Like everyone, I've had many waves. On a personal level, the first that truly crushed me was losing my best friend at 30. It was fast, it was brutal, and it was my first real loss. It taught me something simple but life-changing: everyone goes on, but only a handful of people really matter. So I changed how I spend my time - when I'm in, I'm all in, but only with a few who truly count.

THREAD

From a career perspective, I'll skip the lows and stay optimistic. The highest wave came at Nestlé, when the late CEO simply said, "I trust you, Lynn. Do what you think is right," during some of the most critical, high-stakes moments. That single extension of trust shaped me forever. It taught me that trust, when given freely, is far more powerful than waiting for it to be earned. Trust is the highest wave you can ride - it carries you further than fear ever will

You often say storytelling is at the heart of your work. If you had to tell your own story in just three sentences, how would it sound? Storytelling, for me, is creating magic and taking people on a journey. I always say: show, don't tell; feel, don't listen; and remember - less is more. The best



You've told stories for Nestlé's scientific world, Chalhoub's luxury universe, and even on global stages. What's the most unexpected lesson you carried from one world into the next? Less is more. Across industries, I hope people realize that you need so much less than you think. In food, it starts with reading the label and making an informed decision. In luxury, it's about consuming with intention, not excess. For me, this is the true sustainability - for your health, your happiness, and the future of our planet.

You've sat in rooms where women's voices were rare. What was the turning point where you decided: 'Enough - I'll use my seat at the table to make space for others'? I still feel I have a lot more to do in this space, but my loudest moment came when I became a mother for the first time. I was only 28, a young manager, but I felt a strong will to change the experience for returning moms. The guilt, the sadness, the performance anxiety, the shame of leaving early only to log back in late at night - it was all very real. And back then, working from home was not considered acceptable. I made a decision: if I was staying in the workplace, I would do it transparently. I created a blog called Moms in Suits, where I shared openly about prioritizing my child without compromising my work, and normalizing that conversation. I'd take meetings from the football field so I could watch my son's practice. I wanted to show that once you make your choice, you can make it happen - and as long as you deliver, you should be valued for results, not for clocking in and out. In fact, I was part of the taskforce that ended the clock-in system around 2011. That experience taught me that using your voice isn't about being the most senior in the room - it's about being the most honest.

You're a vocal advocate for Women in Leadership, we can see this through MEPRA, GWPR, and PRCA. What is one story or moment that continues to inspire your work in empowering women within the communications industry? At a certain point in your career, you shift from being the "good student" who wants to prove herself to asking, "How can I contribute to my community, my industry, and the people around me?" That's the mindset shift that inspired me to get actively involved with MEPRA, GWPR, and PRCA. The work these organizations are doing to drive the communications industry forward, and to open more doors for women in comms across the region, is truly inspiring. I'm proud to play even a small part in that journey, because it's no longer just about my own growth, it's about lifting the industry as a whole.

You're an executive, a coach, a podcaster, and a mother of two boys. Let's be real; what actually keeps you sane on the busiest days? What keeps me sane? Assuming I am actually sane! Finally, realizing there is no balance. Life is about compromising daily, but only for the things that truly matter. I was once told, "You have to choose between career, family and wellbeing" - probably the worst advice I ever received, disguised as criticism. I took it and flipped it: those three are my big balls, and they always go into the jar first. Everything else: social events, expectations, even

the so-called idea of balance - is just pebbles, sand, and water. For me, that means weekends may not look like what others call "life," and I'm perfectly fine with that. All I do is recover, workout and see my boys, no dinners, partying, social events... My life is mine, shaped by my own priorities. Each of us has different big balls in our jar, and they don't need to match. Respecting that difference is what real friendship and connection look like. Your sons are growing up watching you hustle, lead, and fight for women's voices. How do you hope this shapes the kind of men they'll become? Having two boys and being a vocal advocate for women in leadership is an interesting mix. They've grown up watching me hustle, take late-night calls, and speak openly about women's voices in the workplace. My hope is simple: that they'll grow into men who respect women's choices - whether that's leading a company or leading a family and see strength in partnership, not competition. If they understand that empathy is not weakness, and that lifting others makes you stronger, then I've done my job. Sometimes this also means I need to be extra careful in how I explain feminism to them. I remind them that true feminism is about loving both men and women, and that its root is equal human rights - the right to vote, the right to pass your nationality to your children, the right to make choices freely. Unfortunately, some simplistic conversations out there try to twist feminism into hating men or claiming superiority, which is not true at all. I want my boys to know the difference, and to grow up proud of equality, not confused by the noise around it.

If I gave you a crystal ball, what bold headline would you want to read about yourself - or women's leadership in the region - five years from now? If I had a crystal ball, the headline I'd want to read is: "The Middle East Sets the Benchmark: 50% of C-Suite Roles in Communications Now Held by Women." Today, women still hold a much smaller share, often in the teens or lower, but I believe the momentum is shifting. Female communicators are increasingly leading the stories of some of the region's most powerful brands, and with the right investment in leadership pipelines, we can get there. And right next to it, I'd love to see: "The Wave Method Reshapes How Leaders Show Up - From the Gulf to Global Stages." Because for me, success isn't just about representation, it's about impact. Leaders, both men and women, who carry themselves with authenticity, resilience, and purpose. If both those headlines came true, it would mean we've not just changed the numbers, but we've truly changed the narrative.

What are the upcoming projects or visions you're most excited about, be it for yourself personally, for Chalhoub Group's communications strategy, or for the future of women's leadership in the region? What excites me most right now is Chalhoub Group's global expansion. Being headquartered in the Middle East yet working on a truly international scale is a privilege. I'm looking forward to continuing this journey under Michael Chalhoub's Vision 2033, which is all about bridging horizons - bringing the best of our region to the world, and the best of the world back to our region. For me, communications will play a central role in making that vision real: connecting cultures, amplifying our unique voice, and showing the world that the Middle East can lead with creativity, innovation, and purpose. Looking back on your journey, is there a piece of advice, perhaps about personal branding, resilience, or leadership that you'd want to pass on to the next generation of female communicators? Show up and start anywhere. Don't wait to have the perfect plan or the perfect moment, because neither exists. My own path was never linear, and most of the best opportunities came from simply saying yes and figuring it

out along the way. Over-engineering your plan can paralyze you, but

showing up opens doors you didn't even know were there.

ave you ever experienced sudden anxiety, brain fog, irritability, or a complete lack of patience for everything around you? If you're in your thirties and it's happening more often than usual, it could be more than burnout. "We're seeing a rise in high-functioning women who present with what they assume is 'burnout' only to discover they are navigating perimenopause," says Hiba Salem, Psychologist and Adult & Families Specialist at Sage Clinics. With her background in clinical and palliative psychology, Salem emphasises that simply recognizing what's happening can be transformational. "Perimenopause, the transitional phase before menopause, typically begins in a woman's early to mid-40s, but for some, it can start as early as their late 30s. It can last anywhere from 4 to 10 years. Unlike the clean-cut milestone of menopause (defined as 12 months without a period), perimenopause is a moving target, often misunderstood by medical professionals, under-researched by scientists, and misinterpreted by the women experiencing it."

AWARENESS & CULTURAL STIGMA

Yet seeking help is rarely easy. Women may identify familiar symptoms such as hot flashes, disrupted sleep, hair loss, loss of concentration, or lacklustre skin, but these changes often chip away at their sense of normality. "There is very little space - or social permission - to feel destabilized. When women are given the language to name their experience, they reclaim agency - and that in itself is therapeutic," notes Salem. Another important factor to consider is ethnicity and culture, both of which shape how a woman experiences and works through this phase of life. To tackle this, she recommends looking beyond Hormone Replacement Therapy (HRT) toward a psychologically informed approach. This can include antidepressants to regulate mood when oestrogen levels fluctuate, along with Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT), psychodynamic therapy, somaticbased practices, and mindful nutrition and movement that not only address weight management but also emotional stability and energy regulation.

Exercise and training to counter muscle loss and declining oestrogen levels are part of the self-care this phase requires. She notes that muscle mass declines by around 10% during menopause and continues to drop by 1% yearly thereafter. Balancing weight training and cardio is key to preparing the body for what's happening. "For a complete beginner, this can start with bodyweight and resistance bands, but very quickly you'll progress past this and





